The voice of God, it would seem, is found in paradox, but it is the voice of someone who knows us intimately and calls each of us by name.

#### **Disaster Risk Management Program**

ABM assists the work of their partner churches in Kenya and the Philippines.

The Philippines is often severely affected by natural disasters. Floods, typhoons, and tsunamis frequently plague the nation, and often strike vulnerable communities.

In Kenya, disasters come in the form of protracted droughts which seriously affect food production. Disaster Risk Management programs empower communities. Depending on the need, training includes; emergency evacuation planning; Caring for the elderly during a crisis; extensive tree planting; and use of drought resistant crops.

# Act for Peace - Christmas Bowl. First Sunday of Advent - Keep awake! be ready! Theme: We are called to walk the path of peace.

The day when nations will not learn war any more (Psalm 2:4) is a day longed for.

The day of the Lord may come when we least expect it. (Matt. 24:44)

In advent we celebrate the coming of the Prince of Peace. War not only causes death and destruction but diverts resources from the great need across the world for feeding, healing and teaching, we are called to pray for the peace of Jerusalem (Psalm 122) and also peace whenever there is strife, violence against minorities, bombings, and discrimination. Christians announce the coming of the light and reject the works of of darkness (Romans 13.12)

Since 1984, Act for Peace and OfERR, a Sri Lankan Tamil refugee run organisation, have partnered to empower and provide support to refugees living in 100 camps in Tamil Nadu, India. The organisation trains refugees so they can become healthcare workers who are able to look after people with disabilities. Doctors, Health care workers, counsellors and other members of the community trained by OfERR also conduct medical screening, provide basic advice on first aid, disease prevention and good nutrition, and give first aid medicines. This has motivated people to adopt better behaviours regarding their health practices. Many people in the camps experience psychological trauma as a result of being displaced for so long. Counselling, group activities and other support services help them rebuild their lives and stay happy and well despite their challenging circumstances.

In 2015, almost 70,000 refugees received help thanks to Act for Peace support. The difference your gifts to the Christmas bowl are making:

Your gift helps to provide a holistic approach to health and hygiene for the people in the camps. This includes nutrition supplements, counselling' support of pregnant women, new mothers and newborns, as well as providing aid and care for those living with disabilities, and enable them to receive the medical attention and care they need.
