

Reading from the book of Isaiah

Chapter 11: Verses 1 – 10.

A shoot shall come out from the stock of Jesse,
and a branch shall grow out of his roots.
The spirit of the LORD shall rest on him,
the spirit of wisdom and understanding,
the spirit of counsel and might,
the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD.
His delight shall be in the fear of the LORD.

He shall not judge by what his eyes see,
or decide by what his ears hear;
but with righteousness he shall judge the poor,
and decide with equity for the meek of the earth;
he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth,
and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked.
Righteousness shall be the belt around his waist,
and faithfulness the belt around his loins.

The wolf shall live with the lamb,
the leopard shall lie down with the kid,
the calf and the lion and the fatling together,
and a little child shall lead them.
The cow and the bear shall graze,
their young shall lie down together;
and the lion shall eat straw like the ox.
The nursing child shall play over the hole of the asp,
and the weaned child shall put its hand on the adder's den.
They will not hurt or destroy
on all my holy mountain;
for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the LORD
as the waters cover the sea.

On that day the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples; the nations shall inquire of him, and his dwelling shall be glorious.

A Reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans, Chapter 15. 4-13.

We who are strong ought to put up with the failings of the weak, and not to please ourselves. Each of us must please our neighbour for the good purpose of building up the neighbour. For Christ did not please himself; but, as it is written, 'The insults of those who insult you have fallen on me.' For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, so that by steadfastness and by the encouragement of the scriptures we might have hope. May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, so that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God. For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the circumcised on behalf of the truth of God in order that he might confirm the promises given to the patriarchs, and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written,

'Therefore I will confess you among the Gentiles,
and sing praises to your name';

and again he says,

'Rejoice, O Gentiles, with his people';

and again,

'Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles,
and let all the peoples praise him';

and again Isaiah says,

'The root of Jesse shall come,
the one who rises to rule the Gentiles;
in him the Gentiles shall hope.'

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

**The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ
according to St Matthew, Chapter 3; verses 1-12**

In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.' This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said,

'The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

"Prepare the way of the Lord,
make his paths straight." '

Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then the people of Jerusalem and all Judea were going out to him, and all the region along the Jordan, and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.

But when he saw many Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruit worthy of repentance. Do not presume to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our ancestor"; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the axe is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

'I baptize you with water for repentance, but one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing-floor

and will gather his wheat into the granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

Last week we focused on the Disaster Risk Management Program in Kenya and the Philippines. This week we look at a project within our own nation.



ABM - Advent Appeal Youth Engagement Program

Throughout Australia, ABM provides grants to help the Church with initiatives which engage young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

In the Northern Territory, funds help small teams of trainers to reach remote communities in Arnhem Land and Islands in the Gulf of Carpentaria. There they provide friendship, pastoral support and training for leaders to equip churches in responding to the substantial challenges confronting Aboriginal young people in remote communities.

Please give to this project to support the Church in loving, listening to and working together with young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. This is one of the two ABM the parish has been supporting throughout the year.

(The other program : A Teenage pregnancy support program in the Moree region.)

Second Sunday of Advent - Prepare the Way *Theme: We are called to repentance.*

Vanuatu Disaster Preparation - Working together to prepare for disaster in Vanuatu

Last years Cyclone Pam was one of a series of natural disasters that have frequently struck the Island of Vanuatu in recent years. These disasters can have devastating impact on houses, farms and businesses, leading to poverty and loss of livelihoods.

Act for Peace partner, Vanuatu Christian Council, helping people come together to form local disaster committees (27 local committees) which include representatives from all sections of the community. Trained "Church Champions", raise local awareness about preparing to be ready, before, during and after a disaster strikes, throughout the different areas and provinces of Vanuatu,.Their aim is to identify disaster risks, analyse the groups in the local

community to establish the most vulnerable, plan how to strengthen their village against future disasters, and plan to respond better, through training and simulation exercises.

Vanuatu is the world's most at risk country for natural hazards, as its position in the Pacific makes it vulnerable to earthquakes, tsunamis, flooding, drought and tropical cyclones.

Act for Peace is working in partnership with VCC on a Disasters Risk

Reduction program, to create safer, more resilient Pacific Island communities. Because the villages of Vanuatu are stretched over such a large number of islands, many communities are cut off from government assistance in times of disaster. Part of the program is to set up Community Disaster Committees that can organise and prepare in the event of a disaster as quick as possible. **World Vision**
