## WELCOME TO CHRISTMAS AT HOLY TRINITY

Over the Christmas season we celebrate the mystery of God coming to earth as a baby. After he was born Jesus was placed in a manger which contained the hay the animals fed on because his parents couldn't find room in the inn. When he grew up Jesus shared many meals with his disciples. He called himself the "Bread of Life." He gave them bread and wine at the last supper he shared with them before he died, and told them to keep doing it in remembrance of him. We call it the Eucharist which means "thanksgiving." Just as the baby Jesus was placed in a feeding trough for animals, so when he grew up he would become food for the world.

At Christmas time we eat and drink a lot to celebrate the festival and enjoy time with our friends and families. Many people try to feed their deeper needs – for love, friendship, self-esteem, power, recognition, meaning – with "food" that can never satisfy those needs. They may feed themselves with lots of money and possessions, or fame or friends. But these things can never satisfy our deepest needs and we always need more and more to feel better about ourselves. Only Jesus feeds those deeper needs within us by inviting us to come to him and feed on him by receiving him into our lives. As God came to us in flesh and blood in the baby Jesus, so he comes to us in the Eucharist as bread and wine.

As you receive Holy Communion this Christmas, may it be a time for you to receive Jesus again as your Saviour, and to renew your faith in Jesus who is the only real food and drink.

# **Mission Report - 25th December**

Christmas Bowl. The Birth of our Lord: Christmas Day The light shines in the darkness Theme: Good News!! Jesus Christ is born

Risen Christ you call us to celebrate the glory of God. We pray for people who don't have enough food to nourish their children. We give thanks for the work of Christian Care in Zimbabwe, teaching farmers conservation farming enabling them to feed their families. We pray for all people responding to environmental changes and challenges. Give us generosity of spirit as we respond from our own abundance to the needs of others. **Amen**.

Act for Peace - Christian Care, leaders in conservation farming techniques, working with farmers in drought-prone areas to improve the capacity to provide food for their families.

Zimbabwe is a country devastated by drought, and farmers struggle to grow enough food. The farming techniques they have used over the years are no longer productive. Families work hours in the boiling hot sun for tiny yields. They struggle to keep their children healthy, they are malnourished and can no longer go to school, they beg for household supplies from neighbours, Some are forced to leave their homes for work, although wages are also low and insufficient for the families to survive on. Christian Care, is an Act for Peace Partner, with trained field coordinators who educate farmers in a new method called **conservation farming, teaching new agricultural skills that can ensure they always have enough food for their families to eat, and producing surplus stock that can be sold to buy food extra livestock.** 

\$25 can provide farmers in Zimbabwe with enough seeds to grow food for their families.

This Christmas, as we remember the journey of Mary and Joseph, and celebrate the Birth of Jesus Christ, with our family and friends, take the time to prayerfully remember the many people throughout our own nation who are without employment, food and shelter, and the masses of people throughout the world, especially where civil unrest and war has caused so much destruction and suffering, and forcing many people to flee, seeking refuge in other countries.
