A Reading from the First Book of Kings Chapter 17, verses 8 to 24

Then the word of the LORD came to him, saying, 'Go now to Zarephath, which belongs to Sidon, and live there; for I have commanded a widow there to feed you.' So he set out and went to Zarephath. When he came to the gate of the town, a widow was there gathering sticks; he called to her and said, 'Bring me a little water in a vessel, so that I may drink.' As she was going to bring it, he called to her and said, 'Bring me a morsel of bread in your hand.' But she said, 'As the LORD your God lives, I have nothing baked, only a handful of meal in a jar, and a little oil in a jug; I am now gathering a couple of sticks, so that I may go home and prepare it for myself and my son, that we may eat it, and die.' Elijah said to her, 'Do not be afraid; go and do as you have said; but first make me a little cake of it and bring it to me, and afterwards make something for yourself and your son. For thus says the LORD the God of Israel: The jar of meal will not be emptied and the jug of oil will not fail until the day that the LORD sends rain on the earth.' She went and did as Elijah said, so that she as well as he and her household ate for many days. The jar of meal was not emptied, neither did the jug of oil fail, according to the word of the LORD that he spoke by Elijah.

After this the son of the woman, the mistress of the house, became ill; his illness was so severe that there was no breath left in him. She then said to Elijah, 'What have you against me, O man of God? You have come to me to bring my sin to remembrance, and to cause the death of my son!' But he said to her, 'Give me your son.' From the Locum

Passing on the Faith: it takes a Community!

Following the Parish Consultation and as we plan and seek our vision for the future as a parish I read this article and found it food for thought as we seek the way ahead:

Today people do not have a grasp of the Christian basics simply by virtue of living in society. Today there are many competing worldviews and stories about life's meaning and purpose. Today modernity and market forces ceaselessly erode tradition and the communities that are the carriers of tradition. Therefore, we believe that a primary task of the church's ministry today is to provide basic and accessible teaching of the Christian faith, in this new era congregations and clergy must think intentionally about how people become Christian." Raymond C. Schulte

"Christians are made, not born," wrote Tertullian. And because of this truth Christianity is in danger of going out of existence with each generation if it is not lived and witnessed to in ways that cultivate and form the next generation. This is quite a challenge to Christian parents and leaders as the urgency of this responsibility within today's context for ministry is only beginning to be perceived. For those of us who grew up in the 1940s and 50s an assumption was made that we were living in a Christian society, and that perhaps the only key decision we had to make was what brand name Christianity we would practice. This is hardly the case for today's world, a time in which for practical purposes Christianity has been rejected. "As long as society is widely permeated by Christian ideas and behavioral patterns, there is no need for Christians to form close-knit communities in order to transmit and preserve their way of life. But as society and its understandings and ways become only marginally Christian, the Church will need to consider becoming a more intentional, disciplined community, without becoming sectarian.

A reading from the Letter of Paul to the Galatians Chapter 1, verses 11-24

For I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that the gospel that was proclaimed by me is not of human origin; for I did not receive it from a human source, nor was I taught it, but I received it through a revelation of Jesus Christ.

You have heard, no doubt, of my earlier life in Judaism. I was violently persecuting the church of God and was trying to destroy it. I advanced in Judaism beyond many among my people of the same age, for I was far more zealous for the traditions of my ancestors. But when God, who had set me apart before I was born and called me through his grace, was pleased to reveal his

Son to me, so that I might proclaim him among the Gentiles, I did not confer with any human being, nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were already apostles before me, but I went away at once into Arabia, and afterwards I returned to Damascus.

Then after three years I did go up to Jerusalem to visit Cephas and stayed with him for fifteen days; but I did not see any other apostle except James the Lord's brother. In what I am writing to you, before God, I do not lie! Then I went into the regions of Syria and Cilicia, and I was still unknown by sight to the churches of Judea that are in Christ; they only heard it said, 'The one who formerly was persecuting us is now proclaiming the faith he once tried to destroy.' And they glorified God because of me.
