

**A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans  
chapter 8, verses 1 – 11**

There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death. For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do: by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and to deal with sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, so that the just requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit. To set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace. For this reason the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God; it does not submit to

God's law—indeed it cannot, and those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

But you are not in the flesh; you are in the Spirit, since the Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. But if Christ is in you, though the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness. If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit that dwells in you.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

Chapter 13, verses 1 – 9, 18 - 23

### **Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ**

That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the lake. Such great crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat there, while the whole crowd stood on the beach. And he told them many things in parables, saying: 'Listen! A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seeds fell on the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and they sprang up quickly, since they had no depth of soil. But when the sun rose, they were scorched; and since they had no root, they withered away. Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Let anyone with ears listen!'

'Hear then the parable of the sower. When anyone hears the word of the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what is sown in the heart; this is what was sown on the path. As for what was sown on rocky ground, this is the one who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy; yet such a person has no root, but endures only for a while, and when trouble or persecution arises on account of the word, that person immediately falls away. As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and the lure of wealth choke the word, and it yields nothing. But as for what was sown on good soil, this is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields, in one case a hundredfold, in another sixty, and in another thirty.'

**Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ**

**Fr. Roy writes:** Maureen recently received information about the Tree of Life from a textile artist friend who lives overseas. This set us talking and thinking about the Tree of Life. The Tree reaches to the light and yet so much of it is in darkness underground. The philosophy behind it is that it links heaven and earth. This set me thinking about the Tree of Life and what it means to me as a Christian. We live in both darkness and light. The darkness overtakes us when we rebel against God and we sin. We struggle in the darkness for a while seeking the light once more. When we turn around and repent, we come into the light once more. God has loved us all the time and forgives us as we repent. We are given a new life in the light of God. It is in this new life in the light of God that we grow spiritually.

This led me to think of my baptism so many years ago as a babe in my mother and father's arms. I had been made in my mother's womb, in darkness until finally I was born and came into the light of this world. My next big adventure was my baptism with water and the Holy Spirit in which I came from the darkness of the world into the light of Christ Jesus. In my lifetime I have experienced many times the darkness of the world and many times I have come out of it into the light of Christ and have grown spiritually as I listen and see what Christ has done for me. I am sure that this darkness and light has not been exclusive to my experience. The circumstances have been different, but your experience is similar to mine. Thanks be to God that our Tree of Life links Heaven and Earth, light and darkness as we grow spiritually in the Light of Christ.

The main roots of any tree are in darkness and it is from the roots in darkness that the rest of the tree with its trunk and branches receives the nourishment it needs to produce fruit. Your spiritual life can grow, likewise, as you work through the darkness with prayer, meditation and listening and seeing the

light of Christ who is with you always through the darkness and the light of your life.

Keep well, keep safe and the blessing of God be upon you and may your days and nights be holy, good and peaceful.
