Roy writes: It seems that every time I have written for the Parish Newsletter recently it has been introduced with a reference to the coronavirus. That is how all possessing it has been and still is possessing every area of our lives. It was interesting and very different to look down from the sanctuary of Holy Trinity Church at the Sunday morning Eucharist and see a mass of expressionless faces, each wearing a face mask. This is a further measure to prevent the infection from community transmission during church worship services.

How are we able to relate this to our spiritual life? I know that temptation and sin are very real in the lives of all people. I believe that God does not allow us to be tempted above that which we are able to resist, but with the temptation will provide us with a way out. Or as I have expressed it on other occasions, we cannot stop temptation from knocking on the door of our lives, our soul, but we do not have to open the door and let the temptation into our life and soul. This is the infection trying to find a home in our life and soul and to take us away from God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

In the same way as we wear a face mask, exercise social distancing and home and hotel isolation to act as a barrier to keep the coronavirus from entering your system so we have our systems to prevent the infection of temptation and sin from entering our life. These include prayer ("Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil"), meditation, using Bible readings as the trigger to our meditation or some other sacred readings of the saints or other writers and allowing God to speak to us in our lives. I. also, believe in angels, not only as messengers of God to his people but also guardians in our life. Here is a prayer that I and countless others use every night before retiring to bed:

"O Lord, open our lips and our mouth shall proclaim your praise."

"Visit this house, O Lord, we pray, and drive far from it the snares of the enemy; may your holy angels dwell with us and guard us in peace, and may your blessing be always upon us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**" (A night prayer from Compline)

Keep well, keep safe and the blessing of God be upon you and on all who you love and may your days and nights be holy, good and peaceful.

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans chapter 11, verses 13 – 36

Now I am speaking to you Gentiles. Inasmuch then as I am an apostle to the Gentiles, I glorify my ministry in order to make my own people jealous, and thus save some of them. For if their rejection is the reconciliation of the world, what will their acceptance be but life from the dead! If the part of the dough offered as first fruits is holy, then the whole batch is holy; and if the root is holy, then the branches also are holy.

But if some of the branches were broken off, and you, a wild olive shoot, were grafted in their place to share the rich root of the olive tree, do not vaunt yourselves over the branches. If you do vaunt yourselves, remember that it is not you that support the root, but the root that supports you. You will say, 'Branches were broken off so that I might be grafted in.' That is true. They were broken off because of their unbelief, but you stand only through faith. So do not become proud, but stand in awe. For if God did not spare the natural branches, perhaps he will not spare you. Note then the kindness and the severity of God: severity towards those who have fallen, but God's kindness towards you, provided you continue in his kindness; otherwise you also will be cut off. And even those of Israel, if they do not persist in unbelief, will be grafted in, for God has the power to graft them in again. For if you have been cut from what is by nature a wild olive tree and grafted, contrary to nature, into a cultivated olive tree, how much more will these natural branches be grafted back into their own olive tree.

So that you may not claim to be wiser than you are, brothers and sisters, I want you to understand this mystery: a hardening has come upon part of Israel, until the full number of the Gentiles has come in.

And so all Israel will be saved; as it is written,
'Out of Zion will come the Deliverer;
he will banish ungodliness from Jacob.'
'And this is my covenant with them,
when I take away their sins.'

As regards the gospel they are enemies of God for your sake; but as regards election they are beloved, for the sake of their ancestors; for the gifts and the calling of God are irrevocable. Just as you were once disobedient to God but have now received mercy because of their disobedience, so they have now been disobedient in order that, by the mercy shown to you, they too may now receive mercy. For God has imprisoned all in disobedience so that he may be merciful to all.

O the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgements and how inscrutable his ways!

'For who has known the mind of the Lord?

Or who has been his counsellor?'

'Or who has given a gift to him,

to receive a gift in return?'

For from him and through him and to him are all things. To him be the glory for ever. Amen.
