**Fr. Roy writes:** Two words have gained prominence in the pandemic in Australia during the past few weeks. They are “bubble” and “hub”, and both are associated with various expressions of football teams and cricket teams and state border crossings. In relation to the football and cricket teams the aim is to avoid hotel isolation for interstate travel with a secondary consideration of binding members and officials into a better team spirit for the task in hand. They live together in a bubble for a time.

I have noticed a change of pattern among our Sunday morning congregation post-worship during the past couple of weeks. When we first resumed the Sunday Eucharist at Holy Trinity, by the time the last person had greeted the three priests there was not another member of the congregation to be seen in the gathering space of the building. Now, I noticed a small bubble, hub or holy huddle gathering towards the doorway. They are maintaining social distancing and still wearing a mask and are talking together. I know the need for social contact, and you have been friends for many years.

May I suggest that in addition to your greeting and social interaction you introduce into this small bubble the opportunity to talk about your faith, your story of God with you in the past week or longer or discussing the worship in which you have been engaged or the sermon or the Scripture readings. This would provide good practice for talking of religion or spirituality with others as part of “gossiping the Gospel” in the cause of evangelising and sharing the love of God in compassion, in redemption in the Son, Jesus Christ.

This is not an organised event but an extension of what some of you are doing already standing round and having a chat, making sure of social distancing.

This suggestion follows on from the last time I wrote to you about opening church borders and “gossiping the Gospel” and sowing the seed to bring others to Christ. I gave you some tips to follow in your evangelistic tasks. Often, we are reluctant to talk about our faith, but we need to tell our story of faith to others that they may share the love of God that we have and to

relate the story of our attempts to live in the Way of Jesus Christ and the blessings it has brought to us.

Come Holy Spirit, come and touch the lives of your people.

“O Lord, open our lips and our mouth shall proclaim your praise.”

Keep well, keep safe and the blessing of God be upon you and on all who you love and may your days and nights be holy, good and peaceful.

**Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ**

Once more Jesus spoke to them in parables, saying: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son. He sent his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding banquet, but they would not come. Again he sent other slaves, saying, "Tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet." But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business, while the rest seized his slaves, maltreated them, and killed them.

### **Ordinary Sunday 28 [Pentecost 19] – Sunday 11 October 2020**

- Exodus 32.1-14; Psalm 106.1-6, 20-24;  
Philippians 4.1-9, [10-23]; Matthew 22.1-14

As with last week's Gospel parable, today's parable was originally aimed at the Jewish religious leaders who rejected Jesus. Going into the thoroughfares reflects Jesus' ministry to the marginal and excluded. The very people who are found unacceptable by the leaders of Jesus' day.

The final twist of the guest without a robe points to the need for us to not only turn up as followers of Christ, but to be willing to participate fully in the ways of his Kingdom.
