

## HOLY BAPTISM

We welcome Jade Moyle-Smith, Emily Smith and Charlotte Smith who will be received into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism this morning at 11.00am. We welcome also the parents, the Godparents, members of his family and friends. God bless you as you make these important promises on their behalf.

**Fr. Roy writes:** You will notice that we have changed the colour of our vestments this morning from the white of Eastertide and Trinity Sunday to green for the Sundays after Pentecost. I have spoken many times of this green season of the Church Year as a time for growing in our faith and spirituality. I shall not try to give a definition of each except to say that the two are closely connected. It is only recently with the upsurgeance of meditation, wellness, mindfulness and other secular ways of slowing down, that the two have been separated. Prior to this most world religions thought of instruction and learning and meditation and contemplation going hand in hand for faith and spirituality to be connected. I am not being negative in the secular ways of meditation, wellness and mindfulness but for Christians and members of other world-wide faith communities they are part of the faith-spirituality concept.

What, then, does this mean for us, the Anglican community that meet in this Holy Trinity complex for worship, teaching, learning and advancement in our spirituality that together has to do with our relationship with God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit?

First, there is involvement in our worship with our praise to God, our thanksgiving for the great benefits we receive from God, to learn in the readings from the Scriptures and the Sermon, to confess our sins and to receive forgiveness, and to be fed with the food and drink of heaven, the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ and finally sent out into the world for another week with the Blessing of God Almighty, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Secondly, there is the study involved as you sit to read the Bible and especially the Gospels that give us a glimpse of the way of Jesus, his teaching, his Passion, Death and Resurrection, Ascension and the life-giving gift of the Holy Spirit. Further, read slowly to allow God to 'speak' to you. You will never know what new thing God wants you to do unless you are prepared to listen and then to step outside your comfort zone and in the strength given by the Holy Spirit **do it**.

Thank God for times when you have done something new that you did not want to do and that has lead you to new life in Christ. We are to walk the Way as children of God.

Come, O Spirit of God,  
and make within us your dwelling place and home.  
May our darkness be dispelled by your light,  
and our troubles calmed by your peace;  
may all evil be redeemed by your love,  
all pain transformed through the suffering of Christ,  
and all dying glorified in his risen life.

### **A reading from Exodus Chapter 24 verses 3-8**

Moses came and told the people all the words of the Lord and all the ordinances; and all the people answered with one voice, and said, 'All the words that the Lord has spoken we will do.' And Moses wrote down all the words of the Lord. He rose early in the morning, and built an altar at the foot of the mountain, and set up twelve pillars, corresponding to the twelve tribes of Israel. He sent young men of the people of Israel, who offered burnt-offerings and sacrificed oxen as offerings of well-being to the Lord. Moses took half of the blood and put it in basins, and half of the blood he dashed against the altar. Then he took the book of the covenant, and read it in the hearing of the people; and they said, 'All that the Lord has spoken we will do, and we will be obedient.' **A reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians  
Chapter 10 verses 14-21**

Therefore, my dear friends, flee from the worship of idols. I speak as to sensible people; judge for yourselves what I say. The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a sharing in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a sharing in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread. Consider the people of Israel; are not those who eat the sacrifices partners in the altar? What do I imply then? That food sacrificed to idols is anything, or that an idol is anything? No, I imply that what pagans sacrifice, they sacrifice to demons and not to God. I do not want you to be partners with demons. You cannot drink the cup of the Lord and the cup of demons. You cannot partake of the table of the Lord and the table of demons.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark  
Chapter 14 verses 12-16, 22-26

**Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.**

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb is sacrificed, his disciples said to him, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city, and a man carrying a jar of water will meet you; follow him, and wherever he enters, say to the owner of the house, "The Teacher asks, Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large room upstairs, furnished and ready. Make preparations for us there.' So the disciples set out and went to the city, and found everything as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover meal.

While they were eating, he took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it he broke it, gave it to them, and said, 'Take; this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he gave it to them, and all of them drank from it. He said to them, 'This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many. Truly I tell you, I will never again drink of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God.'

When they had sung the hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.
