Fr. Roy writes: Recently, I have been thinking about the things that occupy our daily lives, why we do them and what do we receive out of them. Take, for example, a trip to the supermarket. You go because you need groceries and you come out probably with more than you intended to purchase. Why are you polite to the person on the cash register? That the person may be polite to you and help with your bags into the trolley. I think you have the idea; whatever we do in a material way we expect a material reward or a feeling of personal satisfaction.

Most of my writing has not been like that. It has been concerning a greater intimacy with God for which we receive no material reward. For example, if you started meditative walking from last week's writing, it did not help to pay the bills or bring the groceries home. It serves to bring us into a greater intimacy with God with no material benefit. Two things that bring us into a greater intimacy with God are worship and praise.

These are two activities that are easy to "let go" and perhaps difficult to maintain, day in and day out, week in and week out, year in and year out, but why should we continue to practice them?

1. We praise God because of who God is.

God is God, the Lord alone, "maker of heaven and earth, and of all that is seen and unseen". God is loving, forgiving, and merciful who offers peace and healing and redemption through the Son, Jesus the Christ who died for us on the Cross and rose from the dead and who is alive to-day for us.

God is faithful, God never lets us go. We may let God go, but God is ever working to bring us back into that greater intimacy with God.

There is so much more to this reason, but I think that we have the idea firmly in our mind that we worship and praise God because **God is.**

2. We praise God because of what God has done, is doing, and will do.

In my case, I have been fortunate in God's goodness shown to me in birth, in life, in parents, opportunities, in following my vocation and a wife who understands my vocation even in these days of "retirement". I have seen healings in mind, body and soul, with prayers answered. I have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion, Ordination, Marriage, and other sacraments.

God has been good to me, far more than I deserve or expected or for which I have prayed, through the ups and downs of life and for all of this I offer my thanksgiving, my worship, and my praise. God does not abandon us when we stray from the Way. God works all the harder to bring us back to follow in the footsteps of Jesus Christ. Praise God for the love, the passion, the forgiveness, and the Presence God has shown to us in our good times and bad. We worship and praise God, not for what we get out of it, but because God is deserving of our praise. We do, however, get something out of it. God brings us into a greater intimacy with Himself.

Maybe it is a while since you thought of worship, praise, and prayer like this, as an everyday event in your life, as you practice walking in the Way of Jesus. This is now the moment to start or resume this practice.

Keep well, keep safe, keep social distancing, and wear a mask and the blessing of God be upon you and on all who you love and pray for and may your days and nights be holy, good, and peaceful. **AMEN**.

Palm Crosses - Ash Wednesday 2nd March, 2022

Ash Wednesday, 2nd March, marks the beginning of the Season of Lent. This is a Season of penance, contrition, reflection and fasting, a period of 40 days for us to prepare for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday. During this preparation, we are reminded, that **God is gracious and merciful to those who call on Him with repentant hearts.**

Each year the Ashes are prepared using the blessed Palm Crosses from the previous years' Palm Sunday Service.

The symbolic marking of foreheads with ashes, to humble our hearts, remind us that life passes away on Earth. "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return'. Gen. 3:19

Please return your cross by Sunday, 27th February. A Bowl will be placed on the Side Table in the gathering space for the collection of the Palm Crosses. Could you please bring your Palm Crosses from last year to place in the bowl, so that they can be prepared and burned as part of the Parish's preparations for this years' Ash Wednesday services? Ordinary Sunday 4C[Epiphany 4] - Sunday 30 January 2022

Jeremiah 1.4-10; Psalm 71.1-6;
 1 Corinthians 13.1-13; Luke 4.21-30

Today's gospel reading continues the story of the beginning of Jesus ministry in Galilee. Last week the hearers of the passage from Isaiah that Jesus read were delighted. This week, however, not so much. In fact, they wanted to throw him off a cliff. Jesus had quoted stories from Scripture that offended them. He reminded them that in a time of famine God had chosen not someone Jewish, but the widow at Zarephath in Sidon (modernday Lebanon) to be blessed by a visit from the prophet Elijah. She was blessed by never running out of oil and flour. And, to add insult to injury, he mentioned Naaman, the commander of the Syrian army, whom God had healed of his leprosy in the time of Elijah's successor, Elisha. Gentiles being recipients of God's grace was not an idea that pleased those around Jesus that day in the synagogue.

- Lord, may I always live in a way that finds favour with you, no matter how others around me live.
- Give thanks for the work and witness of the Church of North India, remembering especially today their ministry in a predominantly non-Christian context
