

SEASONS BEGINNINGS AND ENDINGS

Towards the end of the Church Year, our lectionary readings focus on the end times and the reign of Christ in glory.

At the beginning of November, we celebrate the Feast of All Saints on November 1st. It can also be celebrated on the first Sunday in November, so we are observing it on Sunday 6th November. All Saints is an opportunity to celebrate those heroes of faith who by the witness of their lives and often by their deaths, serve as examples of faithfulness to our Lord in all circumstances of life.

All Souls' Day, the 2nd November, gives us an opportunity to remember with gratitude those known to us personally who have entered the nearer presence of God. They are often the "unsung heroes" of faith whom we have known and whose memory we hold dear. The Eucharist for All Souls will be celebrated by Fr Roy Hazlewood in the Founders' Chapel at 5pm this Wednesday, 2nd November at 5pm. If you would like a loved one remembered at this Eucharist, please write his/her name on the sheet on the table in the narthex and they will be mentioned during the Intercessions.

The last Sunday of the Church Year is the Feast of Christ the King. This looks to the fulfillment of all things in the reign of Christ in glory. It is also a time to reaffirm our allegiance to the kingdom of God as opposed to those "lesser kingdoms" that seek to rule our lives. We then move into Advent, the season of waiting and preparation for the coming of God among us in the Incarnation of Jesus at Christmas, and his coming again in glory at the end of the age.

A Reading from Daniel Chapter 7, verses 1 – 3 and 15 – 18

In the first year of King Belshazzar of Babylon, Daniel had a dream and visions of his head as he lay in bed. Then he wrote down the dream: I, Daniel, saw in my vision by night the four winds of heaven stirring up the great sea, and four great beasts came up out of the sea, different from one another. As for me, Daniel, my spirit was troubled within me, and the visions of my head terrified me. I approached one of the attendants to ask him the truth concerning all this. So he said that he would disclose to me the interpretation of the matter: 'As for these four great beasts, four kings shall arise out of the earth. But the holy ones of the Most High shall receive the kingdom and possess the kingdom for ever—for ever and ever.'

A Reading from The Letter of Paul to the Ephesians Chapter 1, verses 11 – 23

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance towards redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love towards all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may

give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.
