**The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ
according to St Luke,
Chapter 21, verses 25–38.**

[Jesus said] 'There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in a cloud" with

power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.'

Then he told them a parable: ***'Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.'***

'Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day does not catch you unexpectedly, like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man.'

Every day he was teaching in the temple, and at night he would go out and spend the night on the Mount of Olives, as it was called. And all the people would get up early in the morning to listen to him in the temple.

During each Sunday of the Advent season, we focus on one of the four virtues Jesus brings us: Hope, Love, Joy and Peace. Others consider the lighting of the first candle to symbolize expectation, while the second symbolizes hope, the third joy and the fourth purity. The Christ candle is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day reminding Christians that Jesus is the light of the world. The order and exact wording vary among churches, but the wreath continually reminds us of whom we are called to be as followers of Jesus.

FROM THE LOCUM

ADVENT PONDERINGS 2015

- ◆ Advent could be called a season of waiting. Our human hearts are invited to step into the amazing mystery of the unbelievable creativity and imagination of God plunging himself and embracing our human nature. The word became human and lived among us.' John 1: 42
- ◆ Advent beckons to us. Be still. Be alert. Get into the spirit of the Old Testament folks and yearn for this coming into our lives in a deeper and more contemplative way.
- ◆ Cry out to be receptive and open. Sharpen our awareness of the God within. Widen the tents of our heart so that we become a vessel for the dwelling place of God.
- ◆ When John writes of Jesus saying 'Make your home in me as I make mine in you' could it be Jesus inviting us to listen to Him as he says 'Allow the space in your heart and welcome me in a new and more intimate loving way?'
- ◆ This gift keeps entering our lives at this time- this yearning to come closer— let go- and allow me to be in you.
- ◆ This gift keeps entering our lives as we allow ourselves to keep pondering the mystery of Jesus entering our lives in such an intimate way.
- ◆ We need to hold and treasure the mystery and wonder of the Incarnation near to our heart in solitude and prayer.
- ◆ It is a reminder that Christmas celebrates the Incarnation, not just the Nativity.
- ◆ The Incarnation is an ongoing process of salvation. It is about God entering our world so deeply and continues to take flesh in our midst in every human being,

It is about celebrating our Emmanuel God's continuing birth and transformation in all of creation and ourselves by being totally present in awe and wonder as we continue to live into the mystery of the divine in our midst. The celebration of the birth of the Son of God is the celebration of God allowing us to see him face-to-face. Through the Son of the Virgin of Nazareth we have all found favour for nothing is impossible for God.
