Mission Report – 20th December 2015 Christmas Bowl – Act for Peace

For the past 66 years, the Christmas Bowl has united thousands of compassionate Australians who believe that when we act together, we can make a lasting difference in the lives of people threatened by conflict and disaster.

Giving is an important part of Christian living. All the readings throughout the Christian year usually point us to the ways in which God has given so freely and openly such as Blessings, love, care and consolation. We are encouraged to give ourselves, usually, in time, talents and monetary gifts, offered to God, for the good of God's work in various places.

As we journey this Lent and Christmas time we are focused on God's greatest gift to us, Jesus Christ.

This leads us to consider how we give each Christmas. Do we need to be very specific about our gift to God. As we work together as God's people, we too can make a difference through our giving this Christmas, by being generous to people whom we don't know, or will not even meet, **but whose needs are known to God.**

Christmas is a season for making a difference through our love and generosity.

ACT for Peace are making a difference to the lives of people and communities whose needs are so much greater than our own. After all we are offering what we have to a God and God's ministry as thanks for what God has so freely and lovingly given to us.

John's story.

John is a little boy of eight. Just like any child in Australia, he loves running around outside and playing with his friends. Johns family have been through so much, and were forced out of their home in South Sudan by the civil war. They risked incredible hardship and danger to bring John over the border to a makeshift camp in a small village in Ethiopia.

Living conditions are filthy and shocking. There are no toilets, and people are forced to go to the toilet in the open. Most of the water pumps are broken and flies are everywhere.

With no soap or clean water, John fell seriously ill with "yellow eyes disease" – potentially deadly Hepatitis E. His mother can only watch helplessly as John grows weaker and weaker. She tells us "He can't go and play with his friends. He isn't feeling well at all". For weeks John has been too listless to move. His mother is beside herself with worry, as she has seen others in the camp die

form the disease, and she would do anything to keep her child safe. But there is help for children like John. The first thing he needs to get healthy is access to clean water

Kama's story

Kama was twenty years old, and pregnant, and fled South Sudan when soldiers attacked her village. Kama was terrified of losing her beautiful little boy. When she arrived in the camp she had no possessions, not even a container to carry water from the far away pump.

When illness struck the camp, Kama was worried about who would look after her baby boy if she got sick. Sadly, babies and pregnant women are the most at risk of death from diseases like Hepatitis.

The ACT Alliance were able to help Kama – providing her with a jerry can to carry water, and soap so that she could prevent contamination from deadly diseases.
