A Reading from the first letter to the Corinthians Chapter 13, verses 1 to 13;

If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith,

hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Luke, Chapter 4, verses 21–30.

Then he began to say to them, 'Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.' All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They said, 'Is not this Joseph's son?' He said to them, 'Doubtless you will quote to me this proverb, "Doctor, cure yourself!" And you will say, "Do here also in your home town the things that we have heard you did at Capernaum." ' And he said, 'Truly I tell you, no prophet is accepted in the prophet's home town. But the truth is, there were many widows in Israel in the time of Elijah, when the heaven was shut up for three years and six months, and there was a severe famine over all the land; yet Elijah was sent to none of them except to a widow at Zarephath in Sidon. There were also many lepers in Israel in the time of the prophet Elisha, and none of them was cleansed except Naaman the Syrian.' When they heard this, all in the synagogue were filled with rage. They got up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, so that they might hurl him off the cliff. But he passed through the midst of them and went on his way.

BIBLE SOCIETY

GET THE WORD OUT 2016 – SOUTH AFRICA

Each year the Bible Society focus on a particular country or region, and this year it is South Africa: a nation still struggling with the effects of inequality, more than two decades after the end of apartheid.

GTWO has two projects helping children have a better head start both spirituality and in terms of education. And there's a life-changing programme that takes God's word into South African prisons.

A quarter (25%) of South Africa's 54 million citizens are unemployed and facing economic hardship. Violence and crime is escalating, and prisons overcrowded.

Inequality is still are major issue. The terms 'black' 'white' and 'coloured' is still language that is used in everyday live, sadly, people being identified first and foremost by skin colour.

Almost 22% of South Africans live in extreme poverty, surviving on less than AUD \$3.50 a day and unable to pay for basic nutritional requirements, with over 12 million people struggling just to stay alive. Overall, 54% of South Africa still fall under the national poverty line. Millions live in cramped township of shanty-style (often corrugated iron or pieces of wood) dwellings spreading for kilometres. Many lack basic facilities like toilets and hot water.

The Bible Society cites 'While our hope always rests in the power of God to ultimately change lives, he has also given us an important role to play'

Throughout 2016 the Bible Society Australia is seeking to:

Get The Word Out in South Africa and sow seeds of change.

God's Word is a powerful catalyst, and through small actions big things can happen.
