The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St John, Chapter 20: verses 19-31.

After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.' A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.'

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

MISSION TO SEAFARERS.

GOOD FRIDAY & EASTER GIFTS

Good Friday – Palestine: Health Clinic in Ramallah, a small clinic within the Diocese of Jerusalem. The clinic is located within St Andrew's Episcopal Church hall. The clinic provides early detection of diabetes, management and treatment information is also offered to patients. Specialised equipment for diagnosing and assessing diabetes is required.

Easter Gift – Australia: Youth Engagement in remote communities.

In Northern Australia, over the last decade alarming youth suicide and self harm rates have increased, to the highest in the world. This emphasises that more needs to be offered to youth to find identity and purpose.

The focus is in remote communities of North Queensland, Torres Strait Islands and the Northern Territory. The initiatives will be implemented through local church consultation and NATSIAC and the Dioceses.

This project is currently being supported by our Parish Mission giving, please continue to support this vital missionary work to assist the Youth in need.
