A Reading from the book of the Book of Acts Chapter 9, verses 36-43.

Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, 'Please come to us without delay.' So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, 'Tabitha, get up.' Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.

'Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!'

And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, singing,

'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and might

be to our God for ever and ever! Amen.'

Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, 'Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?' I said to him, 'Sir, you are the one that knows.' Then he said to me, 'These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

For this reason they are before the throne of God,

and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them. They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat; for the Lamb at the centre of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.'

THE HEALING MINISTRY OF THE CHURCH

Sickness is one of the most debilitating aspects of our lives. It makes us feel alone, afraid and vulnerable. During his earthly life Jesus healed many who were sick. He brought hope and new life to those afflicted in mind and body. By his death on the cross and his resurrection from the grave he brought healing and deliverance from the greatest sickness that afflicts us – sin.

Mark's Gospel tells how Jesus sent his disciples out on their mission which included healing the sick and anointing them with oil (Mark 6:13). The Letter of James says, "Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven" (James 5:14, 15).

The sacrament of anointing is a sign of Christ's healing care for us. It tells us that it is only in his strength that we can be delivered from suffering into peace and wholeness. It provides comfort in the knowledge that God loves us and desires what is best for us, even when life seems unfair or painful. People have experienced physical healing as a result of receiving this sacrament. The important thing, however, is surrender to the will of God who suffers with us. Healing involves more than a physical cure — it includes spiritual healing as well, as St James reminds us. It includes peace in the midst of physical suffering even if we are not healed physically. It also includes healing of soured relationships; healing of the brokenness of creation; healing of painful memories.

Anointing is available here at Holy Trinity, Terrigal within the context of the Eucharist. This way we are able to receive God's healing through three of the church's sacramental rites: confession and absolution, anointing and Eucharist. After receiving Communion, move to the left side of the Altar step and a Priest will come and pray with you and anoint you with the Oil of the Sick. Receiving the sacrament of anointing with prayer is an act of faith in the healing power of Christ as well as a calm surrender to his loving purposes.

The oil used is the Oil of the Sick. Fresh oil is blessed by the Bishop each year during Holy Week at a special Eucharist at the Cathedral called the Chrism Mass. Priests of the Diocese then take it back to their Parishes.
