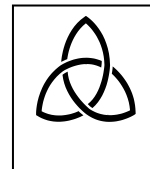

Reading from the book of Jeremiah

Chapter 23: Verses 1 – 6.

Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! says the LORD. Therefore, thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, concerning the shepherds who shepherd my people: It is you who have scattered my flock, and have driven them away, and you have not attended to them. So I will attend to you for your evil doings, says the LORD. Then I myself will gather the remnant of my flock out of all the lands where I have driven them, and I will bring them back to their fold, and they shall be fruitful and multiply. I will raise up shepherds over them who will shepherd them, and they shall not fear any longer, or be dismayed, nor shall any be missing, says the LORD.

**The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ
according to St Luke, Chapter 23; verses 33-43**

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. [[Then Jesus said, 'Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.']] And they cast lots to divide his clothing. And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, 'He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!' The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, 'If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!' There was also an inscription over him, 'This is the King of the Jews.'

One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, 'Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!' But the other rebuked him, saying, 'Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we

deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong.' Then he said, 'Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.' He replied, 'Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise.'

The voice of God, it would seem, is found in paradox, but it is the voice of someone who knows us intimately and calls each of us by name.

ACT FOR PEACE - CHRISTMAS BOWL APPEAL

Week 1. The Reign of Christ the King

"At Christmas we join in celebrating God's gift to us in the birth of Jesus Christ. Christmas is also a time to join together in making a gift to those who are in need.

Theme: We are called to love and be loved.

LetThemStay is a new campaign supported by Australian Churches Refugee Taskforce, an Act for Peace initiative, which aims to create a new, more compassionate attitude to refugees and people seeking safety.

The Taskforce started in February, when priest, doctors, nurses and schoolchildren took to the streets to protest the return of 267 people, including 37 babies, to offshore detention camps.

Baby "Asha" was in Australia due to limited medical treatment on Nauru, and was under threat of being returned to the Nauru immigration processing centre with her family, as well as other families in similar situations. As a result of the incredible outpouring of passionate support from churches, concerned Australians and politicians, the Federal Government allowed most of these families to stay in community detention in Australia.

The campaign highlighted what can be achieved when people come together to fight for compassion and decency instead of hate and intolerance. People fleeing war and terror are human beings with hopes, fears, and dreams just like ours.

#LetThemStay showed that thousands of Australians believe they deserve a fair hearing and decent treatment, not brutality and cruelty.

More than 100 churches and cathedrals across Australia declared themselves places of sanctuary for the 267 people seeking asylum. To prevent them from being deported offshore.

"Historically churches have afforded sanctuary to those seeking refuge from brutal and oppressive forces. We offer this refuge because there is irrefutable evidence from health and legal experts that the circumstances asylum seekers, especially children, would face if sent back to Nauru are tantamount to state-sanctioned abuse,"

"We feel so desperate that we need to do something desperate. This fundamental.y goes against our faith, so our church community is compelled to act."

Throughout the #LetThemStay campaign the Christian community demonstrated strength, unity, and courage. Together, we forced the government to hear our voices and made love, not hatred the winner.

Australian Human Rights Commission report 2014, stated that 85% of parents and children indicated their mental health was negatively affected while in detention.

Your gift promotes a shared Christian vision of compassion and hospitality for asylum seekers and refugees, helping to create a climate of compassion for refugees in Australia.

\$100 can provide a baby "essentials" package including nappies, cotton pads and lotions for the #LetThemStay mums and babies who are in community detention in Australia.
