Reading from the book of Isaiah Chapter 49: Verses 8-16a.

Thus says the LORD: In a time of favour I have answered you, on a day of salvation I have helped you; I have kept you and given you as a covenant to the people, to establish the land, to apportion the desolate heritages; saying to the prisoners, 'Come out', to those who are in darkness, 'Show yourselves.' They shall feed along the ways, on all the bare heights shall be their pasture; they shall not hunger or thirst, neither scorching wind nor sun shall strike them down, for he who has pity on them will lead them, and by springs of water will guide them. And I will turn all my mountains into a road, and my highways shall be raised up. Lo, these shall come from far away, and lo, these from the north and from the west, and these from the land of Syene. Sing for joy, O heavens, and exult, O earth; break forth, O mountains, into singing! For the LORD has comforted his people, and will have compassion on his suffering ones. But Zion said, 'The LORD has forsaken me, my Lord has forgotten me.' Can a woman forget her nursing-child, or show no compassion for the child of her womb? Even these may forget, yet I will not forget you. See, I have inscribed you on the palms of my hands; Hear the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God

Psalm: 131.

O Lord, my heart is not proud: nor are my eyes haughty. I do not busy myself in great matters: or in things too wonderful for me.

But I have calmed and quieted my soul like a weaned child upon its mother's breast: like a child on its mother's breast is my soul within me. O Israel, trust in the Lord: from this time forward and for ever.

A Reading from the first Letter of Paul to the Corinthians, Chapter 3. 18 - 4.5.

Do not deceive yourselves. If you think that you are wise in this age, you should become fools so that you may become wise. For the wisdom of this world is foolishness with God. For it is written,

'He catches the wise in their craftiness',

and again,

'The Lord knows the thoughts of the wise,

that they are futile.'

So let no one boast about human leaders. For all things are yours, whether Paul or Apollos or Cephas or the world or life or death or the present or the future—all belong to you, and you belong to Christ, and Christ belongs to God.

Think of us in this way, as servants of Christ and stewards of God's mysteries. Moreover, it is required of stewards that they should be found trustworthy. But with me it is a very small thing that I should be judged by you or by any human court. I do not even judge myself. I am not aware of anything against myself, but I am not thereby acquitted. It is the Lord who judges me. Therefore do not pronounce judgement before the time, before the Lord comes, who will bring to light the things now hidden in darkness and will disclose the purposes of the heart. Then each one will receive commendation from God.

Hear the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

Alleluia, **alleluia!** The word of God is living and active; it probes the thoughts and motives of our hearts. **Alleluia!**

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Matthew, Chapter 6, verses 22-34

'The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light; but if your eye is unhealthy, your whole body will be full of darkness. If then the light in you is darkness, how great is the darkness!

'No one can serve two masters; for a slave will either hate the one and love the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth.

'Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? Therefore do not worry, saying, "What will we eat?" or "What will we drink?" or "What will we wear?" For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

'So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today.

LENT 2017

In two weeks we begin our Lenten journey. During this holy season, with Christians around the world we refocus our lives and attention on the saving events of Jesus' passion, death and resurrection. Jesus spent forty days in the desert. I invite you to join with me as we go with Jesus into the wilderness this Lent. Jesus was part of a tradition of holy people who spent time in the loneliness and harshness of the desert – Moses, Elijah, John the Baptist – where they were able to focus on God without distraction and material comforts in order to pray and spend time with God. The desert is a place of clarification. That's what we will be doing for the forty days.

The devil tempting Jesus was an attempt to direct his life away from God. The same happens to us. Lent is an opportunity to redirect our lives, our thoughts and our attitudes toward our relationship with God once more. The three temptations – making the satisfaction of bodily or material needs the centre of life; the yearning for glory, honour and esteem; the temptation to exercise power and to manipulate others – all divert our focus away from God and toward ourselves. In Lent we go with Jesus into the desert to be stripped down and to refocus on God.

Various Lenten practices assist us in doing this: studying and meditating on the scriptures, prayer, fasting and abstinence, giving to the poor and needy, being more dedicated in receiving the sacraments – especially penance and the Eucharist – all help us to relive and renew our baptism. The following are some suggestions to assist you in some of these practices.

- The Anglican Board of Mission (ABM) has made available a devotional booklet, *Into the Desert*, which contains a Bible reading for each day of Lent, a short reflection and suggestions for prayer. Copies are \$6. To order your copy please place your name on the appropriate sign-up sheet on the table at the Church door. If you prefer to download the booklet, you can purchase it by visiting <u>www.intothedesert.org</u>.
- ABM envelopes will be distributed on Sundays in Lent. Three projects are being offered for you to choose: i) Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Ministry in remote communities in Numbulwar-Eastern Arnhem Land

developing liturgies in the language of their people for special services like Ash Wednesday and Easter; ii) **Gender and Governance Initiative in Zambia** through the Zambia Anglican Council to improve gender equality; iii) **Church Growth in The Philippines** – the Episcopal Church in the Philippines proclaims the Good News of salvation through preaching, liturgical celebrations and action. The programme aims to grow the Church and strengthen its activities in social transformation.

- Lenten Study Groups include: i) Whispers of Love meditation group on Mondays at 10.00am will be doing a Lenten reflection: Up from the Waters: Reflecting, Sharing, Living the Gospel; ii) Lectio divina (sacred reading) will continue to meet on Wednesdays at 5.30pm. The Eucharist will be celebrated at 5.00pm in the Founders' Chapel; iii) Lenten studies using the Lent Study 2017 booklet, Spare a Minute by Bishop John Frank Ford of the Diocese of The Murray will be offered on Sunday mornings at 11.00am, Thursday evenings at 7.30pm, Friday mornings at 11.30am. The studies encourage renewed understanding of what it means to be baptised, using the Sunday Gospel readings as the basis. Please indicate your interest on the sign-up sheet on the table at the Church door. Booklets are \$9.95.
- Ash Wednesday Liturgies (Eucharist with the Imposition of Ashes) will be held on 1st March at 8.30am, 12 midday, and 5.00pm. The Eucharist will be celebrated on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays at 8.30am during Lent.
