**A reading from the book of Exodus
Chapter 33: verses 12-23.**

Moses said to the LORD, 'See, you have said to me, "Bring up this people"; but you have not let me know whom you will send with me. Yet you have said, "I know you by name, and you have also found favour in my sight." Now if I have found favour in your sight, show me your ways, so that I may know you and find favour in your sight. Consider too that this nation is your people.' He said, 'My presence will go with you, and I will give you rest.' And he said to him, 'If your presence will not go, do not carry us up from here. For how shall it be known that I have found favour in your sight, I and your people, unless you go with us? In this way, we shall be distinct, I and your people, from every people on the face of the earth.'

The LORD said to Moses, 'I will do the very thing that you have asked; for you have found favour in my sight, and I know you by name.' Moses said, 'Show me your glory, I pray.' Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy,

To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the
Lord Jesus Christ:

Grace to you and peace.

We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labour of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. For we know, brothers and sisters beloved by God, that he has chosen you, because our message of the gospel came to you not in word only, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction; just as you know what kind of people we proved to be among you for your sake. And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for in spite of persecution you received the word with joy inspired by the Holy Spirit, so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. For the word of the Lord has sounded forth from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but in every place where your faith in God has become known, so that we have no need to speak about it. For the people of those regions report about us what kind of welcome we had among you, and how you turned to God from idols, to serve a living and true God, and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead—Jesus, who rescues us from the wrath that is coming.

**The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ
according to Matthew 22: verses 15–33.**

Then the Pharisees went and plotted to entrap him in what he said. So they sent their disciples to him, along with the Herodians, saying, 'Teacher, we know that you are sincere, and teach the way of God in accordance with truth, and show deference to no one; for you do not regard people with partiality. Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?' But Jesus, aware of their malice, said, 'Why are you putting me to the test, you hypocrites? Show me the coin used for the tax.' And they brought him a denarius. Then he said to them, 'Whose head is this, and whose title?' They answered, 'The emperor's.' Then he said to them, 'Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's.' When they heard this, they were amazed; and they left him and went away.

The same day some Sadducees came to him, saying there is no resurrection; and they asked him a question, saying, 'Teacher, Moses said, "If a man dies childless, his brother shall marry the widow, and raise up children for his brother." Now there were seven brothers among us; the first married, and died childless, leaving the widow to his brother. The second did the same, so also the third, down to the seventh. Last of all, the woman herself died. In the resurrection, then, whose wife of the seven will she be? For all of them had married her.'

Jesus answered them, 'You are wrong, because you know neither the scriptures nor the power of God. For in the resurrection they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but are like angels in heaven. And as for the resurrection of the dead, have you not read what was said to you by God, "I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob"? He is God not of the dead, but of the living.' And when the crowd heard it, they were astounded at his teaching.

World Vision

Introducing **Mariane Habimana** - our new Parish World Vision sponsored child.

Mariane was born on the 15th April, 2008. Mariane lives with her parents and her three sisters in the Cumba Area Development Program in Burundi. Both her father and mother are farmers.

Mariane attends school and is in grade 1. Her favourite subject is mathematics, and she enjoys ball games, and she also carries water to help out at home.

Burundi is a small land locked country in east Africa. It shares borders with Rwanda, Tanzania, and the Democratic Republic of Congo. Bujumbura is the capital and the main languages is Kirundi (the majority of the people living in the CADP are Burundian and speak Kirundi), French and Swahili. Christianity is the major religion and there is a small number of Muslims. Over 90 percent of people earn their living from agriculture. Major exports include coffee, tea, sugar and cotton.

The sponsored children are chosen from the most vulnerable families.

Our Parish sponsorship of Mariane assists World Vision provide her, children, families and communities meet basic needs in areas such as education, healthcare and access to clean water, and also helps farmers to improve their skills so that they can grow more food and conserve the natural environment. As well, it supports internally displaced people to reintegrate into their communities and live in harmony.

Area development programs are a defined area, home to around 20,000 people or more.

It is an area which has been identified where communities are suffering because of poverty. Local people work with World Vision to determine their specific needs, and help them develop and carry out projects to improve children's wellbeing in the long term. The projects aim to transform the life of the child, and community they live in, through development and improvements made in the community, made possible through the ongoing sponsorship and support.

Burundi is a resource poor country, where children face huge challenges. The decade-long civil war, overpopulation and drought and soil erosion have seriously affected the subsistence economy. Large numbers of people displaced

by the conflict have been unable to produce food, and have become largely dependent on international humanitarian assistance.

Over the years the parish have sponsored several children, and it is truly such a delight to see them grow up, and have new opportunities, as a result of their ongoing sponsorship.


