# A reading from the second letter to the Corinthians

Chapter 4, verse 13 - Chapter 5, Verse 1.

But just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture—'I believed, and so I spoke'—we also believe, and so we speak,because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. # The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark, chapter 3, verses 20-35.

# Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

And the crowd came together again, so that they could not even eat. When his family heard it, they went out to restrain him, for people were saying, 'He has gone out of his mind.' And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem said, 'He has Beelzebul, and by the ruler of the demons he casts out demons.' And he called them to him, and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. ## **ABM'S LIVELIHOODS PROJECT - KENYA**

The Sustainable Livelihoods Program has had a significant impact on reducing hunger and increasing incomes of local farming communities. However, many households are woman-headed, so ongoing support and training is desperately needed.

The project targets Community-based Organisations (CBO), which are essentially trained and registered community organisations, with nominated representatives from various existing groups in Kenyan villages.

The CBO generally meet once a month to become trained in areas such as; Proposal writing; Drought resistant crops; Tree planting; Drip irrigation; Sand Dam construction; Water management; Farm ponds; Marketing; Budgeting; Disability inclusion and Child protection.

As a result of being in the program since it was introduced, the Kalawani CBO has now graduated and have become empowered to take on many issues that arise. Produce is now being sold at a common market which has been created to sell local produce. Also, the Kalawani CBO have set up a registered credit union which has grown out of their Village Savings and Loans program.

This was incredibly successful in raising capital for new business ventures within the CBO community and will enable people to save and borrow from a much larger entity, increasing the loan amounts available for business activity.


