LIGHTING OF THE FOURTH ADVENT CANDLE

BLESSED IS SHE WHO BELIEVED. From Bethlehem, the least of the clans of Judah, and from a peasant girl, Mary, one of the least of the Jewish people, God prepared a body for Jesus, the saviour of the world. As we rejoice in the saviour who has come to visit us, we also join Elizabeth in praising Mary for her faith, her love and her obedience.

We have lit the candles of *hope*, *peace* and *joy*. Today we light the candle of *love*. The angel Gabriel told Mary a special child would be born to her. The birth of Jesus gave joy to his mother and his coming into the world also brings joy. But it was because God loved the world that he gave the gift of his Son. Through the love of Mary and Joseph, Jesus was nurtured and cared for. Jesus taught and healed because he loved. He gave his life in love.

Love is like a light shining in a dark place. As we look at the light of this candle, we celebrate the love of God shown in Christ.

Lord God, you chose the Blessed Virgin Mary to be the mother of your incarnate Son. With Joseph, she loved Jesus and cared for him until he was revealed to the world.

Give us the same love to help us witness to your Son and so spread the Good News of your love. Make us ready to welcome him. Amen.

He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

GIVING BIRTH WITH MARY

At this busy time of year, the Church invites us to reflect again on the strange events recorded in the Gospels that tell of the birth of Jesus. In today's Gospel, we hear about Mary, who was chosen to bear the One who would grow up and save the world from all that spoils it and inhibits its flourishing. When the angel announced to her that she would be giving birth, she said, "Let it be done to me according to your word." In her "Yes" to God, Mary sets us an example of quiet yet confident trust in the promises of God. There was fear, too. To have faith doesn't mean completely understanding; it doesn't mean never doubting or questioning.

Mary, in bearing the Son of God in her womb, shows us how we can carry Christ to the world. Each of us is called to allow Jesus to be born in us and then to bear him to the world – to be his body, his hands and feet and voice. This brings Christmas right to where we are. The Church is called Christ's *body*, the means

of his working and ministering in the world. God is again incarnate, made flesh, in the Church. This is what makes being a Christian, a follower of Jesus, so exciting and fulfilling. We are involved in the work of God in the world!

But to do this requires God's grace; it isn't something we can do in our own strength or by our own resources. The current economic and environmental challenges we face on a global scale have surely convinced us of that. The Archbishop of Canterbury has called it a "reality check".

Yet, as the angel told Mary, "nothing will be impossible with God". In response, we pray with Mary, "Let it be with me according to your word." As we gather around the Lord's table to share the Eucharist, or Mass – Christmas is *Christ's Mass* – we receive in the bread and wine the very presence of God. Jesus is born in us again. We then go forth in the name of Jesus to incarnate, to embody, to en-flesh his life to others. What a wonderful privilege *and* responsibility.

Let us praise the Lord of heaven and earth for his gift to us, and let us share that gift with the world, in loving service and lavish generosity.

Church to Church Program - Language & Training Centre at St Peter's Bible School

In the Diocese of Taungoo, the Church of the Province of Myanmar is committing to the education program outlined in its strategic plan. 170 miles from Yangon, there are many young people and children from low income families desperate to access English language and computer courses, and music training for better opportunities.

Funding for this project will allow St Peter's Bible School to establish an English Language Centre, to offer such training for young people, irrespective of their religious background.

Life in Myanmar has changed rapidly in recent years and there are many demands on young people.

Project Coordinator, the Rev Aung Khaing Nyunt said, "Young people and children who are from low income families but eager to learn English language and computer do not have many opportunities but those who live in different parishes within Taungoo Diocese will be able to come to this project."

"English language becomes an essential language for young people not only for their further education but also for job opportunity. Therefore, this project will be very useful for their future dreams," he said
