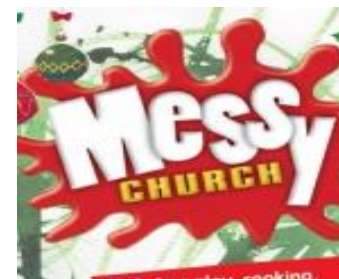

A Reading from the First Book of Kings Chapter 21, verses 1 to 21a

Later the following events took place: Naboth the Jezreelite had a vineyard in Jezreel, beside the palace of King Ahab of Samaria. And Ahab said to Naboth, 'Give me your vineyard, so that I may have it for a vegetable garden, because it is near my house; I will give you a better vineyard for it; or, if it seems good to you, I will give you its value in money.' But Naboth said to Ahab, 'The LORD forbid that I should give you my ancestral inheritance.' Ahab went home resentful and sullen because of what Naboth the Jezreelite had said to him; for he had said, 'I will not give you my ancestral inheritance.' He lay down on his bed, turned away his face, and would not eat.

His wife Jezebel came to him and said, 'Why are you so depressed that you will not eat?' He said to her, 'Because I spoke to Naboth the Jezreelite and said to him, "Give me your vineyard for money; or else, if you prefer, I will give you another vineyard for it"; but he answered, "I will not give you my vineyard."' His wife Jezebel said to him, 'Do you now govern Israel? Get up, eat some food, and be cheerful; I will give you the vineyard of Naboth the Jezreelite.'

So she wrote letters in Ahab's name and sealed them with his seal; she sent the letters to the elders and the nobles who lived with Naboth in his city. She wrote in the letters, 'Proclaim a fast, and seat Naboth at the head of the assembly; seat two scoundrels opposite him, and have them bring a charge against him, saying, "You have cursed God and the king." Then take him out, and stone him to death.' The men of his city, the elders and

Stepping Stones Out Reach Team - provided support for young people 14- 24 who are homeless or at risk of homelessness through

- * client focused services
- * assistance & support for young people who remain in the home to prevent homelessness
- * information, advice and advocacy - assistance with DOH, Centrelink, and other agencies.
- * links with appropriate services e.g. Young mums groups, education, counselling
- * work with young people towards identifying goals
- * assistance with transition to independent living, and transitional housing

Intensive Family Support

This outreach service offers high level case management through counselling, parenting groups, advice and referral, skills development and sport to families. The program is designed to empower families to work together on achieving goals and outcomes that they determine. (referral by Family and Community Services only)

Early Intervention and Activities (EIA) Team Central Coast

Support for young people aged between 9 - 18.

School based program's, skill- based and therapeutic programs which are for individual and family casework. Focus areas on the Central Coast are Killarney Vale, Tumby Umbi, Bateau Bay and Wyong (service available to all young people in Wyong Shire)

EIA can help young people with Schooling issues and options, employment, relationships- family and friends, reconnect families, skill development, provide links to others services, self - esteem, confidence, positive communication.

the nobles who lived in his city, did as Jezebel had sent word to them. Just as it was written in the letters that she had sent to them, they proclaimed a fast and seated Naboth at the head of the assembly. The two scoundrels came in and sat opposite him; and the scoundrels brought a charge against Naboth, in the presence of the people, saying, 'Naboth cursed God and the king.' So they took him outside the city, and stoned him to death. Then they sent to Jezebel, saying, 'Naboth has been stoned; he is dead.'

As soon as Jezebel heard that Naboth had been stoned and was dead, Jezebel said to Ahab, 'Go, take possession of the vineyard of Naboth the Jezreelite, which he refused to give you for money; for Naboth is not alive, but dead.' As soon as Ahab heard that Naboth was dead, Ahab set out to go down to the vineyard of Naboth the Jezreelite, to take possession of it.

Then the word of the LORD came to Elijah the Tishbite, saying: Go down to meet King Ahab of Israel, who rules in Samaria; he is now in the vineyard of Naboth, where he has gone to take possession. Mission Report - 16th June

Samaritans - building community, building connections.

There are many Grandparents in our community, who for many different reasons, are fulfilling the role of the main parental carer for their grandchildren.

Kinship Care - also known as GAPS (Grandparents as Parents) is a service which is available to assist the many Grandparents who suddenly find themselves in the new role as the main provider for their grand children, at a time of their life when they were planning for their retirement.

Samaritans offer peer support groups, community forums, and information on how to access financial assistance, and legal assistance if required, to ensure that their grandchildren are receiving the most adequate care.

On the Central Coast, the Kinship Care support groups are located at Bateau Bay, Gorokan and Morrisset. There are another 10 Kinship Care groups located throughout the Diocese of Newcastle. Other groups are currently being formed.

These groups are a place where all are warmly welcome to receive the friendship offered by each other, talk openly about their difficult experiences - without any judgement being passed, and be able to help each other. It is a peer group which is encouraging and respectful, and provides a real sense of kinship, a friendly extended family.

Stepping Stones

This is a Crisis Refuge for youth aged between 12-17 years who are homeless. The home provides short term accommodation (for up to 3 months), and an emergency overnight bed, in a safe environment.

Stepping Stones assists young people through individual client case planning. They offer information, advice, referral and advocacy, links to other services, and important emotional support. Young people are encouraged to set their own goals, develop skills and independence to work towards, healing of

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ

One of the Pharisees asked Jesus to eat with him, and he went into the Pharisee's house and took his place at the table. And a woman in the city, who was a sinner, having learned that he was eating in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster jar of ointment. She stood behind him at his feet, weeping, and began to bathe his feet with her tears and to dry them with her hair. Then she continued kissing his feet and anointing them with the ointment. Now when the Pharisee who had invited him saw it, he said to himself, 'If this man were a prophet, he would have known who and what kind of woman this is who is touching him—

that she is a sinner.' Jesus spoke up and said to him, 'Simon, I have something to say to you.' 'Teacher,' he replied, 'speak.' 'A certain creditor had two debtors; one owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. When they could not pay, he cancelled the debts for both of them. Now which of them will love him more?' Simon answered, 'I suppose the one for whom he cancelled the greater debt.' And Jesus said to him, 'You have judged rightly.' Then turning towards the woman, he said to Simon, 'Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave me no water for my feet, but she has bathed my feet with her tears and dried them with her hair. You gave me no kiss, but from the time I came in she has not stopped kissing my feet. You did not anoint my head with oil, but she has anointed my feet with ointment. Therefore, I tell you, her sins, which were many, have been forgiven; hence she has shown great love. But the one to whom little is forgiven, loves little.' Then he said to her, 'Your sins are forgiven.' But those who were at the table with him began to say among themselves, 'Who is this who even forgives sins?' And he said to the woman, 'Your faith has saved you; go in peace.'

Soon afterwards he went on through cities and villages, proclaiming and bringing the good news of the kingdom of God. The twelve were with him, as well as some women who had been cured of evil spirits and infirmities: Mary, called Magdalene, from whom seven demons had gone out, and Joanna, the wife of Herod's steward Chuza, and Susanna, and many others, who provided for them out of their resources.

This week there has been a number of changes to working with Children Checks. This will effect all clergy, all authorised lay ministers, lay liturgical assistants and authorised lay preachers, All SRE teachers, all voluntary workers with children and youth, or undertake spiritual or religious leadership and have (or may have) contact with children. All those who under take those roles and have, direct face to face contact with children must complete the new Working with Children Check (WWCC). >From 15 June, the Working with Children Check involves a two stage application process in which a person completes on line form and then goes to a designated centre (such as RTA) to be identified.

Successful applications will receive a WWCC number. The new check will be free for volunteers. Clergy and paid volunteers'
