After these things the word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, 'Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great.' But Abram said, 'O Lord God, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?' And Abram said, 'You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir.' But the word of the Lord came to him, 'This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir.' He brought him outside and said, 'Look towards heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your descendants be.' And he believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness.

Psalm 33, verses 13 - 21

The Lord looks down from heaven and surveys all the children of Adam: he considers from his dwelling-place all the inhabitants of the earth;

He who fashioned the hearts of them all: and comprehends all that they do.

A king is not saved by a mighty army: nor is a warrior delivered by much strength;

A horse is a vain hope as a deliverer: nor can he rescue any by his great power.

But the eye of the Lord is on those that fear him: on those that trust in his unfailing love,

To deliver them from death: and to feed them in the time of dearth.

We have waited eagerly for the Lord: for he is our help and our shield.

Surely our hearts shall rejoice in him: for we have trusted in his holy name.

Let your merciful kindness be upon us, O Lord: even as our hope is in you.

A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews

Chapter 11, verses 1 – 3, 8 – 16

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. By faith he received power of procreation, even though he was too old—and Sarah herself was barren—because he considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, `as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore.'

All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.

Alleluia, **alleluia!** Be watchful and ready: you know not when the Son of Man is coming. **Alleluia!**

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke, Chapter 12, verses 32-40

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom. Sell your possessions, and give alms. Make purses for yourselves that do not wear out, an unfailing treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

'Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit; be like those who are waiting for their master to return from the wedding banquet, so that they may open the door for him as soon as he comes and knocks. Blessed are those slaves whom the master finds alert when he comes; truly I tell you, he will fasten his belt and have them sit down to eat, and he will come and serve them. If he comes during the middle of the night, or near dawn, and finds them so, blessed are those slaves.

'But know this: if the owner of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.'

More on Money

This last week the stock market took a pummelling, dropping significantly as a reaction to the US-China trade war. Headlines such as, Trade war fears send shudder through stock markets captured the mood generated by developments in the trade wars. The strange thing about situations like this is that life goes on as usual for most of us. We may start to see prices and interest rates fluctuate, but we don't suddenly become destitute. We don't move from a position of plenty to there suddenly being less of everything. It has long been recognised that the rise and fall of the stock market, especially for big investors, is based on emotion. People are rattled and some start to panic, not because their situation has suddenly worsened in real terms, but as an emotional reaction to the news. Emotion, sentiment and perception are very human factors. Politicians play on our fear of scarcity.

As citizens of the Kingdom of God, our attitude to the world and the Church will be different to that. It will be reflected in the way we act as stewards or managers of all that's been entrusted to us by God. It will not be informed by a narrow and limiting approach that operates from the standpoint of scarcity and lack - and thus operates on the basis of fear, appealing to our insecurities - but from one of plenty and abundance. Jesus' parables are replete with images of God's abundance and lavish generosity. There are no stock market crashes or recessions or budget deficits in the kingdom of heaven! By that I don't mean we live in some sort of fantasy land where financial realities do not exist. What it means is that there is always enough to do what God wants God's nature is one of abundance and generosity. us to do. Scarcity arises from lack of faith or limited vision. "Freely you have received, freely give."

Pew Reflections

The Ninth Sunday After Pentecost [Pentecost 9] - Sunday 11 August 2019

Isaiah 1.1, 10-20; Psalm 50.1-8, 23-24;
 Hebrews 11.1-3, 8-16 (17-28); Luke 12.32-40

Genuine faith in God shows itself in actions as all today's readings suggest - like helping people in their needs and (like Abraham) following through on what we understand God wants us to do in our lives. When we centre our lives on God as our 'master', and seek to live by that faith in generous love towards others in their needs, 'it is (our) Father's good pleasure to give (us) the kingdom' – to enjoy life in relationship with God now, and on beyond the grave.

- Give thanks for the Church of Bangladesh, remembering especially today their ministry in a predominantly non-Christian context.
