A reading from Jeremiah Chapter 14 verse 7-10, 19-22

Although our iniquities testify against us, act, O Lord, for your name's sake; our apostasies indeed are many, and we have sinned against you. O hope of Israel, its saviour in time of trouble, why should you be like a stranger in the land, like a traveller turning aside for the night? Why should you be like someone confused, like a mighty warrior who cannot give help? Yet you, O Lord, are in the midst of us, and we are called by your name; do not forsake us!

Thus says the Lord concerning this people: Truly they have loved to wander, they have not restrained their feet; therefore the Lord does not accept them, now he will remember their iniquity and punish their sins. Have you completely rejected Judah? Does your heart loathe Zion? Why have you struck us down so that there is no healing for us?

We look for peace, but find no good; for a time of healing, but there is terror instead. We acknowledge our wickedness, O Lord, the iniquity of our ancestors, for we have sinned against you. Do not spurn us, for your name's sake; do not dishonour your glorious throne; remember and do not break your covenant with us. Can any idols of the nations bring rain? Or can the heavens give showers? Is it not you, O Lord our God? We set our hope on you, for it is you who do all this.

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it.'

SEASONS BEGINNINGS AND ENDINGS

Towards the end of the Church Year, our lectionary readings focus on the end times and the reign of Christ in glory.

At the beginning of November, we celebrate the Feast of All Saints on November 1st. This is an opportunity to celebrate those heroes of faith who by the witness of their lives and often by their deaths, serve as examples of faithfulness to our Lord in all circumstances of life.

All Souls' Day, on the 2nd November, gives us an opportunity to remember with gratitude those known to us personally who have entered the nearer presence of God. They are often the "unsung heroes" of faith whom we have known and whose memory we hold dear.

The last Sunday of the Church Year is the Feast of Christ the King. This looks to the fulfillment of all things in the reign of Christ in glory. It is also a time to reaffirm our allegiance to the kingdom of God as opposed to those "lesser kingdoms" that seek to rule our lives. We then move into Advent, the season of waiting and preparation for the coming of God among us in the Incarnation of Jesus at Christmas, and his coming again in glory at the end of the age.

There will be a Eucharist on **All Saints' Day** (Friday 1st November) at **10.30am** in the Chapel. The following day,

Saturday, is **All Souls** and the Eucharist is at **8.30am** in the Chapel. If you would like a loved one remembered at this Eucharist, please write his/her name on the sheet on the table in the narthex and they will be mentioned during the Intercessions.
