Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! says the Lord. Therefore, thus says the Lord, the God of Israel, concerning the shepherds who shepherd my people: It is you who have scattered my flock, and have driven them away, and you have not attended to them. So I will attend to you for your evil doings, says the Lord. Then I myself will gather the remnant of my flock out of all the lands where I have driven them, and I will bring them back to their fold, and they shall be fruitful and multiply. When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. [[Then Jesus said, 'Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.']] And they cast lots to divide his clothing. And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, 'He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!' CHRIST THE KING

Recently, John Henry Newman was canonized as a saint. The Prince of Wales, who attended the Canonization Mass in St Peter's Square in Rome, said we need people like Newman who can draw together in a world of division. Yes, he did leave the Church of England to become a Roman Catholic, eventually being made a cardinal. He began what came to be known as the Oxford Movement in the Church of England. This movement eventually gave birth to what later became known as Anglo-Catholicism within the Anglican Communion.

Newman and others, like John Keble sought to call the Church back to its apostolic foundation, rather than seeing its legitimacy as dependent on the State. Devotion to the basics of church life, such as constancy in prayer and worship, receiving the sacraments, care for the poor and needy, and proclamation and teaching, were emphasised.

It also saw the revival of many features that had been lost at the time of the Reformation, such as men's and women's religious communities, the centrality of the Eucharist in the church's worship, greater attention to the church's liturgical life, and engagement in social issues such as working in the slums of London.

With the division we see in the church and the world, we would do well to heed their call back to the basics of living as disciples of Christ. Today we celebrate the kingship of Christ. There are many competing voices – consumerism, atheism - clamouring for our attention. Let's heed the voice of Jesus calling us to prayer, mission and proclamation. Many would lead us to believe our Communion is on the verge of schism. Let us return to our apostolic foundation, leaving minor matters aside, trusting the promise of Jesus that the Spirit would lead us into all truth.

Pew Reflections Last Sunday After Pentecost [Christ the King] - Sunday 24 November 2019

 Jeremiah 23.1-6; A Song of Zechariah (APBA pp 10, 425) or Psalm 46; Colossians 1.11-20; Luke 23.33-43

Today we see what Jesus' kingship is about, and it's quite the opposite of the sort of monarchy that we might see, say, in the Downton Abbey film: *Fulfilled is now what David told / in true prophetic song of old, / how God the nations' King should be; / for God is reigning from the Tree.* Jesus our King has given up his life so that we might win eternal life with him.
