### Isaiah 60.1-6

Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you.
For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples;
but the Lord will arise upon you, and his glory will appear over you.
Nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn.

Lift up your eyes and look around; they all gather together, they come to you; your sons shall come from far away, and your daughters shall be carried on their nurses' arms. Then you shall see and be radiant; your heart shall thrill and rejoice, because the abundance of the sea shall be brought to you, the wealth of the nations shall come to you. A multitude of camels shall cover you, the young camels of Midian and Ephah; all those from Sheba shall come.

# Hear the word of the Lord Thanks be to God Psalm 72.1-7, 10-14

Give the king your judgement, O God: and your righteousness to the son of a king, That he may judge your people rightly: and the poor of the land with equity. Let the mountains be laden with peace because of his righteousness: and the hills also with prosperity for his people. May he give justice to the poor among the people: and rescue the children of the needy, and crush the oppressor. May he live while the sun endures: and while the moon gives light, throughout all generations. May he come down like rain upon the new-mown fields: and as showers that water the earth. In his time shall righteousness flourish: and abundance of peace, till the moon shall be no more. The kings of Tarshish and of the isles shall bring tribute: the kings of Sheba and Seba shall offer gifts. All kings shall fall down before him: and all nations do him service. He will deliver the needy when they cry: and the poor that have no helper. He will pity the helpless and the needy: and save the lives of the poor. He will redeem them from oppression and violence: and their blood shall be precious in his sight.

### Ephesians 3.1-12

This is the reason that I Paul am a prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles— for surely you have already heard of the commission of God's grace that was given to me for you, and how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote above in a few words, a reading of which will enable you to perceive my understanding of the mystery of Christ. In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that is, the Gentiles have become fellow-heirs, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

Of this gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given to me by the working of his power. Although I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given to me to bring to the Gentiles the news of the boundless riches of Christ, and to make everyone see what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things; so that through the church the wisdom of God in its rich variety might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. This was in accordance with the eternal purpose that he has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord, in whom we have access to God in boldness and confidence through faith in him. I pray therefore that you may not lose heart over my sufferings for you; they are your glory.

# Matthew 2.1-12

# Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, 'Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.' When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, 'In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

"And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,

are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler

who is to shepherd my people Israel." '

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, 'Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage.' When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure-chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

# LIFT UP YOUR HEARTS

The words that introduce the Great Thanksgiving at the Eucharist are called the *Sursum Corda*, Latin for "Lift up your hearts." We probably never say those words outside the context of the liturgy. It's an unusual phrase. What does it mean? How do you "lift up your hearts"? When we move from being sad to feeling happy, we may say "I feel my spirits have been *lifted*." On the contrary, when someone is in a bad mood or depressed, we may say, "He/she is '*down* in the dumps."

Worship is exaltation. "O praise the Lord with me: let us exalt his name together" (Psalm 34:3). The word exalt means to raise or lift up; to elevate someone to a higher rank or position or to speak very highly of someone. Our liturgy provides us with a number of opportunities in addition to the Sursum Corda, to do that: singing hymns of praise, elevation of the sacred species as we sing or say the doxology: "Blessing and honour and glory and power are yours for ever and ever"; incense rising into the air, raising our hand to make the sign of the cross. These and other actions assist us to worship with our bodies, not just our minds and hearts. They focus us on what we're doing. For some reason, many avoid them. Before I became an Anglican, I always liked how congregations in Anglican services knelt – something that never happened in the denomination in which I was brought up. Now we don't even do that.

Many would rather worship be easy and cosy and simple, with minimum effort. "Liturgy" means the *work* of the people. It's not a leisure activity. When we treat it as such, it becomes a drag. Bishop Robert Atwell says, "Religion has become something we do in our spare time, a leisure activity that competes for our attention. Worship has evolved into an optional extra" (*The Good Worship Guide,* Robert Atwell, Canterbury Press, p. 7, 2013). To elevate something requires effort. To lift up takes more energy than to set down. To exalt or speak well of someone takes more energy than tearing down and criticising them. It takes more effort to sing than to speak. To sing well requires our bodies to be straight and erect with our lungs drawing in the oxygen. We burn more calories when we sing! But this doesn't mean that worship exhausts and drains us. It requires effort, and it actually energises us. Worship lifts us out of our everyday lives into the atmosphere of heaven. When we exalt or raise the name of God, we find ourselves exalted.
