THE EPIPHANY – DATES AND CUSTOMS

In *The Book of Common Prayer* The Epiphany is given a subtitle – 'The Manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles'. From the moment Christ became incarnate in flesh and blood, the Good News (gospel) of Jesus Christ is for everyone: Jew and Gentile, wise and simple, rich and poor, male and female.

The date chosen to celebrate the visit of the Wise Men or 'Magi' stems from the choice to celebrate the Nativity of Christ on the Winter Solstice. The northern European pre-Christian tradition celebrated the birth of the Sun on 25 December. The Mediterranean and East customarily observed January 6 as the Solstice. As often happens, the two dates merged into a beginning and an ending of the same celebration. The Western Church adopted 'the twelve days of Christmas' which reached its climax on 'Twelfth Night', the eve of Epiphany. The implication by the fifth century was that this was when the Magi arrived. It all became even more complicated when the calendar in the West changed from the Julian to the Gregorian Calendar. The Eastern Church refused to accede to what was considered a radical change. So the 6 January remains the chief day for celebrating the Incarnation in Orthodox Churches. The Epiphany is celebrated on the 19 January.

The lectionaries of the Anglican and the Roman Catholic Churches allow Epiphany to be celebrated on the nearest Sunday to January 6. The focus is the Magi as representatives of the Gentiles. Jesus was also manifested at his Baptism when the dove alighted upon him and the voice came from heaven saying, "this is my Beloved Son, in whom I am well-pleased." The Sunday after Epiphany is the Baptism of Christ. In the Orthodox Churches, the Magi are included at Christmas, and the Epiphany gives more emphasis to the Baptism of Christ.

Prayer of the Day

Lord God of the nations, we have seen the star of your glory rising in splendour: may the brightness of your incarnate Word pierce the night that covers the earth, signal the dawn of justice and peace, and beckon all nations to walk as one in your light. We ask this through Jesus Christ, your Word made flesh, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, in the splendour of eternal light, God for ever and ever. **Amen.**

A reading from Isaiah Chapter 60, verses 1-6

Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you. For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the LORD will arise upon you, and his glory will appear over you. Nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn. Lift up your eyes and look around; they all gather together, they come to you; your sons shall come from far away, and your daughters shall be carried on their nurses' arms. Then you shall see and be radiant; your heart shall thrill and rejoice, because the abundance of the sea shall be brought to you, the wealth of the nations shall come to you. A multitude of camels shall cover you, the young camels of Midian and Ephah; all those from Sheba shall come. They shall bring gold and frankincense, and shall proclaim the praise of the LORD. Hear the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

1 Give the king your judgement, O God: and your righteousness to the son of a king,

2 That he may judge your people rightly: and the poor of the land with equity.

- 3 Let the mountains be laden with peace because of his righteousness: and the hills also with prosperity for his people.
- 4 May he give justice to the poor among the people: and rescue the children of the needy, and crush the oppressor.
- 5 May he live while the sun endures: and while the moon gives light, throughout all generations.
- 6 May he come down like rain upon the new-mown fields: and as showers that water the earth.

A reading from the Letter of Paul to the Ephesians Chapter 3, verses 1-12

This is the reason that I Paul am a prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles— for surely you have already heard of the commission of God's grace that was given to me for you, and how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote above in a few words, a reading of which will enable you to perceive my understanding of the mystery of Christ. In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that is, the Gentiles have become fellow-heirs, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

Of this gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given to me by the working of his power. Although I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given to me to bring to the Gentiles the news of the boundless riches of Christ, and to make everyone see what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things; so that through the church the wisdom of God in its rich variety might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. This was in accordance with the eternal purpose that he has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord, in whom we have access to God in boldness and confidence through faith in him.

Alleluia, alleluia!

We have seen his star in the East; and have come to adore the Lord.

Alleluia!

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, 'Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.' When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, 'In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

"And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,

are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler

who is to shepherd my people Israel." '

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, 'Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage.' When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure-chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

The Epiphany – Tuesday 6 January 2021

Isaiah 60.1-6; Psalm 72.1-7, 10-14;
Ephesians 3.1-12; Matthew 2.1-12

One of the Greek kings the middle east before the time of Jesus called himself *Seleucius Epiphanes* meaning God manifest or revealed. He was one of the most oppressive and hated of all the kings of the Greek East. - Quite a different revelation here! The Epiphany as the Showing of the Christ to the Gentiles (i.e. us).

If we deal with the text and not the Christmas postcards, we have an undisclosed number of wisemen, who represent the Gentile world; and 3 gifts - and what symbolic gifts they are! Gold for a king; frankincense for the divinity of Jesus and myrrh suggesting preparing for burial. Like all good Christmas theology, we see the birth of Jesus in the shadow of the cross.
