

Fr Roy Writes: On this sixth Sunday of Easter as we prepare for the Feast of the Ascension it is a good time to think of the disciples of Jesus from the time of his Passion, death and Resurrection to the Ascension. At the time of the death and resurrection of Jesus, Peter and the other disciples needed to show penitence for their actions during this dark time of their lives. Thus, the Church needs to be penitent for the previous dark times in the life of the Church, including the present time with the recent Royal Commission Report. We cannot expect others who are looking for the Light of Christ to change their ways to the ways of God through Jesus unless we are a penitent Church who show that Light, and the Hope and the New Life that comes from the Resurrection. Then with the coming of the Holy Spirit afresh into lives at the Feast of Pentecost, a penitent Church and its people will show that Light, and the Hope and the New Life that comes from the Resurrection.

At the present time we are suffering from another epidemic that seems to have increased as a result of the coronavirus. This epidemic is domestic violence, whether it is physical harm, sexual, bullying, or controlling, that is sweeping Australia and many parts of the world. We need to think and give thanks for the part that women and children play in our society and in the world and yet many of them are subjected to domestic violence of one kind or another in the home or workplace. Some people report the incidents of domestic violence while the majority continue to live in circumstances that allow the continuation of the violence. The people who are involved in this issue need our prayers and the prayers of the world and the support of local communities as well as governments and leaders in other areas of our society. One of the causes of this epidemic is that many people have little or no respect for other people. Last time I wrote to you I pointed out the uniqueness of each person, man, woman and child is created by God in our mother's womb and living to fulfil our vocation in the world. Jesus Christ is the light of the world, reflecting the Light of the Father and because we have Christ in our heart so we are to reflect the Light of Christ to those around us.

From Psalm 139 verse 14: "I am fearfully and wonderfully made." And St. Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 15 verse 10: "By the grace of God, I am what I am".

A reading from 1 John Chapter 5 verses 1-12

Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth. There are three that testify: the Spirit and the water and the blood, and these three agree. If we receive human testimony, the testimony of God is greater; for this is the testimony of God that he has testified to his Son. Those who believe in the Son of God have the testimony in their hearts. Those who do not believe in God have made him a liar by not believing in the testimony that God has given concerning his Son. And this is the testimony: God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John Chapter 15 verses 9-17

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.
