**Fr. Roy writes:** Advent is a time of expectations as we look at the past and the future with Jesus. For us the past goes back thousands of years to the prophets in the Old Testament where they listened to God and tried to direct the people to follow God in what God was doing in preparation for times to come.

Now we come to God's events far more recent, a mere couple of thousand years ago, remember "One day is with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day." 2 Pet 3:8. We find God preparing Mary for the visit of the archangel Gabriel whereby she is asked to be the mother of Jesus, the Messiah. "Then Mary said, 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.'" Luke 1:38. Therefore, many Christians throughout the world speak of holy Mary, Mother of God (that is, of God in the Flesh in Jesus).

Further to God's preparation we have John the Baptizer and his father's encounter with God's angel in the Temple in Jerusalem, then John's birth and later his ministry among the people for true repentance in preparation for the coming of the Messiah. With the birth of Jesus, shepherds hear the message of the angel and come to find him with his family in the manger in Bethlehem. Later, the Magi from the East following the star to find Jesus in a house.

A few decades later we have Jesus preparing his disciples and other followers for the journey to Jerusalem with teaching about his Way, his Passion, Death, Resurrection and Ascension and later his Second Coming. It is to this Second Coming that we look with great expectation whereby we put on the robes of immortality to follow God wherever we may be led.

This is very nice to have before us and feel as though we are part of it, but what has it to do with us?

First, we learn to live with the past starting with the days of our lives before we became a follower of Jesus. Perhaps that period still needs to hear John the Baptizer's call to repentance. On the other hand, we look at the way God brought us to the Way of Jesus.

Secondly, look at 2021 with the good and the bad. Look at the times when we can see the work of God in our lives directing us in the Way of Jesus, when we have followed God's call. Give thanks to God for these occasions. As we look at the bad when we have disobeyed God's call or ignored it and fallen into sin, we repent, confessing our sins and receiving absolution, forgiveness through God's love and mercy.

We have the rest of the week to look in this way before we celebrate the First Coming of Jesus and to prepare for the rest of our lives to expect his Second Coming. Remember this is closer than when you first believed.

Keep well, keep safe, keep social distancing, and wear a mask when you need it and the blessing of God be upon you and on all who you love and pray for and may your days and nights be holy, good, and peaceful and have a wonderful Christmastide. **AMEN.**

### **LIGHTING OF THE FOURTH ADVENT CANDLE**

BLESSED IS SHE WHO BELIEVED. From Bethlehem, the least of the clans of Judah, and from a peasant girl, Mary, one of the least of the Jewish people, God prepared a body for Jesus, the saviour of the world. As we rejoice in the saviour who has come to visit us, we also join Elizabeth in praising Mary for her faith, her love and her obedience.

We have lit the candles of *hope*, *peace* and *joy*. Today we light the candle of *love*. The angel Gabriel told Mary a special child would be born to her. The birth of Jesus gave joy to his mother and his coming into the world also brings joy. But it was because

God loved the world that he gave the gift of his Son. Through the love of Mary and Joseph, Jesus was nurtured and cared for. Jesus taught and healed because he loved. He gave his life in love.

Love is like a light shining in a dark place. As we look at the light of this candle, we celebrate the love of God shown in Christ.

**Lord God, you chose the Blessed Virgin Mary to be the mother of your incarnate Son. With Joseph, she loved Jesus and cared for him until he was revealed to the world.**

**Give us the same love to help us witness to your Son and so spread the Good News of your love. Make us ready to welcome him. Amen.**

## **Advent 4C**

### **– Sunday 19 December 2021**

- Micah 5.2-5a; For the Psalm *Song of Mary* or Psalm 80.1-7; Hebrews 10.5-10; Luke 1.39-45 (46-55)

Today's readings highlight what for me is the essence of Christianity: That Jesus came to save us, particularly the lowly, downtrodden and insignificant – that is, you and me. Sometimes I think we (and the powers that be in all aspects of life) place too much emphasis on who we are, where we fit in society and how important someone (us included) might be. Jesus and Mary both epitomise the humblest of origins, insignificant in the wider world. We should remember this – we have been chosen by God to represent his values on this earth and live our lives to be an example of his love.

- Pray that we may always act to reflect God's love, and work to empower those who have little power or position to lift themselves up.
- Give thanks for the work and witness of the Episcopal Church of South Sudan.
