Prayer and anointing for healing are available at each Eucharist. If you would like prayer and anointing, please move in front of the step, at the left side of the altar, after receiving communion and a priest will come and minister to you.

Something that has been valued as a spiritual exercise is the Daily Examen, which is a form of prayerful reflection on the events of the day in order to discern God's presence and direction in our lives. It is an ancient practice of the Church that enables us to see God's hand at work in our whole life experience.

The following is an adaptation of the Daily Examen from the *Spiritual Exercises* of Ignatius Loyola. It is a habit that not only Jesuits, but many other Christians practice, especially during Lent. I hope you find it helpful.

DAILY REVIEW OF LIFE

(Also called 'The Examen of Conscience')

In this kind of prayer, I am not trying to "achieve" anything. I am not trying to change the world or change God. I am simply wanting to PAY ATTENTION. God has been with me all through the day, but much of the time I have not been aware of this fact.

God has been trying to guide me, but I haven't always been listening. This type of prayer is about waking up.

This kind of prayer assumes that God is constantly trying to call me to deeper life in Christ and that I can become more sensitive to that call by paying careful attention to my feeling responses throughout the day.

Step 1: Become present to the moment

Wherever I am (under a tree; at home; sitting in the train), become aware of the present moment. Observe what I can taste, smell, see, hear, touch. Become aware of any tension in my body (without trying to change or "fix" it). Become aware of the fact that, by God's grace, I am breathing.

Step 2: Placing myself within the “big story”: the Paschal Mystery

Begin by reading and reflecting on a passage of scripture such as from Daylight Reading notes or a lectionary.

Step 3: Recollection

Think over what I have done today, since I woke up – all the various activities that I have done and people I have met.

Step 4: Thanksgiving

For what today do I feel most grateful? For example:

- When did I feel especially connected to God or to another human being? Where was Christ today?
- Were there moments when I felt fully alive?
- Were there moments when I felt joy: peace; or compassion (which might have included tears)?
- Were there any moments when I felt really good about loving myself or another person?
- Were there moments when I made a difficult but loving decision?

Step 5: Confession

For what today do I feel least grateful? For example:

- When did I feel especially disconnected from God or from another person?
- Were there moments when I was aggressive or abusive of another person?
- Were there moments when I felt disproportionate/non-productive anger, stress, or agitation?
- Were there moments when I avoided a necessary action?

In relation to any of the above, ask myself:

- a) What was the unmet need in me?

b)What underlying assumptions/values were operating in me?

Thank God for these feelings as opportunities to allow God's grace to work in me.

Step 6: Intention/reorientation of desire.

What might these reflections lead me to do? For example:

What do I desire to do more of?

(Laying aside "shoulds/oughts")

What do I desire to do less of?

What do I desire to do differently?

How do I desire for God to help me?(see Romans 7:14-20)

Step 7: Absolution

Finish by making a personal statement which reminds me of God's forgiveness, mercy, and absolute love for me and God's world. An example is given below, along with Psalm 139.

God loves me. God wants me to have abundant life. I can do nothing to earn or achieve this love. Nothing I have done or could ever do can separate me from God's love in Christ. This love does not depend on what I think of myself or what other people think of me. My entire value depends on the fact that I am made in God's image and am God's creation. In God's eyes, I am the one who God made and loved before I ever uttered a word or thought a thought. God loves me.

Sentence

Our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ.

But Abram said, 'O Lord GOD, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?' And Abram said, 'You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir.' But the word of the LORD came to him, 'This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir.' He brought him outside and said, 'Look towards heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your descendants be.' And he believed the LORD; and the LORD reckoned it to him as righteousness.

Then he said to him, 'I am the LORD who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess.' But he said, 'O Lord GOD, how am I to know that I shall possess it?' And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.
