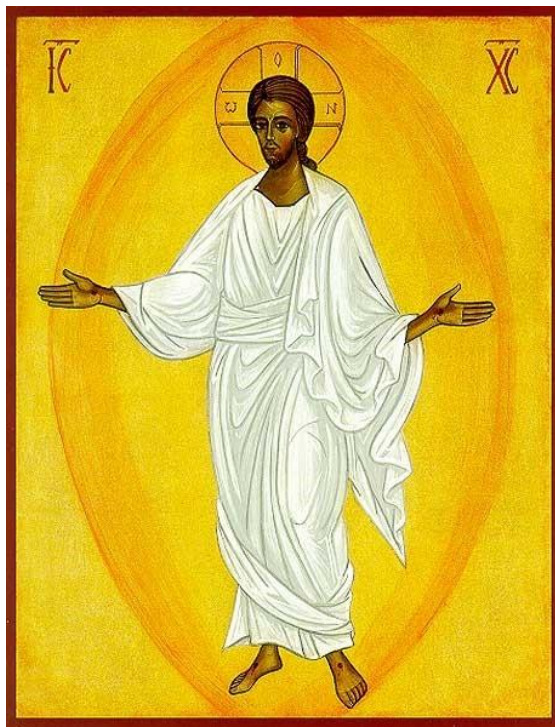


**Welcome to worship at Holy Trinity, Terrigal

Fr. Roy writes: Christ is Risen, Alleluia, He is Risen indeed, Alleluia.

Yes, it is still in Eastertide, and in fact, we can still proclaim the same message that Jesus is Risen for the remainder of our days on this earth. After that the excitement and truth is ours for eternity.

In the meantime, we continue to learn from the season of Easter, about God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, about Jesus Christ, the Son of God and ourselves in the life we live in Christ.

Last week, on Anzac Day, I participated in the Anzac Day service at the Doyalson RSL as I have for many years in my days in the Parish of Toukley -- Budgewoi and since my "retirement". Here the principal theme was SACRIFICE. This was the sacrifice of defence personnel who left our shores to fight for our country in time of war, and the sacrifice of families who saw them off in troopships and in many cases did not see them return.

To-day, the Third Sunday of Easter, we join with the Family of God, the Community of the Church, to proclaim the Risen Christ, to participate in worship, in Word and Sacrament and to leave this house of worship, with joy in our hearts, into the world in which we live day by day in the Light of the Risen Christ. In our worship, we are reminded of the sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross and of our sacrifice in following him in our lives. In the Sunday Liturgy we pray "Father, we offer ourselves to you as a living sacrifice through Jesus Christ our Lord to live and work to your praise and glory".

Into this broken world of darkness, we go with its war, terrorism, oppression, mass murders, gangs and violence, climate change and other behaviour that we see as selfish. It is into this that we go bearing the Good News of the Risen Christ with the hope that comes with the light of his new life, love, compassion, forgiveness and so much more that will transform the world.

People ask me if they should pray for the death of dictatorial and authoritarian leaders. I suggest that it would be better for them to pray for such leaders' deliverance from the darkness of the evil one and be brought into the Light of the Risen Christ and all the

changes to thinking and behaviour that that Light brings to people. My suggestion, then, is PRAY, PRAY, PRAY.

Keep well, keep safe, keep social distancing, have a safe, and holy Eastertide and the blessing of God be upon you and on all who you love and pray for and may your days and nights be holy, good, and peaceful. **AMEN.**

Meanwhile Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest and asked him for letters to the synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any who belonged to the Way, men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem. Now as he was going along and approaching Damascus, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?' He asked, 'Who are you, Lord?'

The reply came, 'I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. But get up and enter the city, and you will be told what you are to do.'

Then I saw between the throne and the four living creatures and among the elders a Lamb standing as if it had been slaughtered, having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent out into all the earth. He went and took the scroll from the right hand of the one who was seated on the throne. When he had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell before the Lamb, each holding a harp and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. They sing a new song:

'You are worthy to take the scroll

and to open its seals,

for you were slaughtered and by your blood you ransomed for God

saints from every tribe and language and people and nation; you have made them to be a kingdom and priests serving our God,

and they will reign on earth.'

Then I looked, and I heard the voice of many angels surrounding the throne and the living creatures and the elders; they numbered myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands, singing with full voice,

'Worthy is the Lamb that was slaughtered

to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might

and honour and glory and blessing!'

Then I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, and all that is in them, singing,

'To the one seated on the throne and to the Lamb

be blessing and honour and glory and might

for ever and ever!'

And the four living creatures said, 'Amen!' And the elders fell down and worshipped.

Hear the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

Alleluia, alleluia!

Christ is risen; the Lord of all creation;
he has shown pity on all people.

Alleluia!

**The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John
Chapter 21 verses 1 - 19**

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

After these things Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; and he showed himself in this way. Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing.' They said to him, 'We will go with you.' They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, 'Children, you have no fish, have you?' They answered him, 'No.' He said to them, 'Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some.' So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord!' When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on some clothes, for he was naked, and jumped into the lake. But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, only about a hundred yards off.

When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, 'Bring some of the fish that you have just caught.' So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred and fifty-three of them; and though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, 'Who are you?' because they knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave

it to them, and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my lambs.' A second time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Tend my sheep.' He said to him the third time, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, 'Do you love me?' And he said to him, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep. Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go.' (He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.) After this he said to him, 'Follow me.'

Easter 3C – Sunday 1 May 2022

- *Acts 9.1-6 (7-20); Psalm 30; Revelation 5.6-14; John 21.1-19*
John tells us today about the third of the appearances of Jesus after the Resurrection and how, like at the beginning of his ministry when he called the disciples (see Mark 1 and Luke 5) that the fishermen's nets were groaning with a good haul. Then, at the end of the story after the fish had been grilled, we see Jesus grilling Peter. He asks Peter three times whether he loves him. Getting more and more hurt Peter answers yes each time. Each time Jesus then responds with a command: look after the flock. If I were to examine myself, would I find areas of my life where I have claimed to love Jesus but acted as if it were otherwise? Have I failed to provide love and care for those who are around me?
- Jesus Christ, Risen Lord, help me to love you in my heart, and to demonstrate it by my care for others.
- Give thanks for the Church of the Province of Central Africa, remembering especially the work of the Zambia Anglican Council.
