**Fr Roy Writes:** On this Trinity Sunday it is good that we should think about peace. We pray for peace in the world, for peace in our lives and in our relationships with others and the natural world around us. We regularly use words like "The Peace of God that passes all understanding keep our hearts and minds in the love of God and of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord." What, then, does all this mean for our daily lives?

Prior to Jesus' Resurrection, the disciples were filled with gloom. They had witnessed the Passion of Jesus, the trial, Peter's denial, their own fleeing from the drama of the Crucifixion. During the next few days, they met together in a room with the door locked, they were afraid of the Jewish hierarchy and were still filled with gloom. On the night of the resurrection the gloom changed, and it was replaced by peace, the peace that Jesus had promised to them, and the peace that no one else could give nor take away.

This is Jesus, the Son of the Godhead, the Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, whose life, death, and Resurrection has won for the early disciples and for us that "peace which passes all understanding".

This was prophesied by Zechariah, the father of John the Baptist in the last verse of the Benedictus, "To shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace."

When we come to the resurrection appearances the first word that Jesus utters is "peace" to his frightened disciples.

In the Eucharist, "peace" is used with the heading 'THE GREETING OF PEACE' and during this section we have "Christ has reconciled us to God in one body by the cross. We meet in his name and

share his peace." "The peace of the Lord be always with you. And also with you." Also, there is the prefix before the blessing "The Peace of God that passes all understanding keep our hearts and minds in the love of God and of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord." And the dismissal "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord".

The world sees peace as an absence of war, the absence of worry and anxiety, and the absence of greed and so on. On the other hand, the Christian sees peace as a presence, the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace in our lives through his resurrection and ascension.

Peace for the Christian is closely connected with eternal life, that is, with us now, in the present that goes through physical death into the peace of the eternal life with God. There is no need to worry or be anxious about death. The peace that Jesus brings to our lives now is still with us at the time of death. His life with us, including Crucifixion and Resurrection is still there bringing the peace that overcomes our worry and anxiety.

Yet, despite the reassurance of the peace of Jesus in our lives, many are still anxious about the past, the present and the future in our lives. Concerning the past, our anxiety about our achievements or more likely what we could have done if circumstances had been different and of the present, our anxiety about being able to cope if we are struck with a serious illness and of the future, our anxiety about a catastrophe whereby we lose all our possessions.

The Christian Faith tells us that God's love for us never fails. Jesus is explicit in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 6:25-33) concerning worry and our lives. We can read it for ourselves and follow St. Paul's advice "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." (Philippians 4:6).

Keep well, keep safe, keep social distancing, and the blessing of God be upon you and on all who you love and pray for and may your days and nights be holy, good, and peaceful. **AMEN.**

## **Trinity Sunday C – Sunday 12 June 2022**

- Proverbs 8.1-4, 22-31; Psalm 8; Romans 5.1-5; John 16.12-15

Today's reading from Proverbs talks about Holy Wisdom. If you've ever been to Istanbul you'll have seen the former Church of the Holy Wisdom. For almost a thousand years after its construction, it was the largest cathedral in all the world. For Orthodox Christians, Holy Wisdom is Jesus Christ himself. During the Orthodox Church's Divine Liturgy a deacon will cry out 'Wisdom! Let us attend!' at points in the service to ensure that the congregation is listening to sacred teaching. And this is our sacred teaching: that our God is one God in three persons – God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. *O Trinity, O Unity! Be present as we worship thee, and with the songs that angels sing unite the hymns of praise we bring.*

If I were to examine myself, would I find times in my life where I had focused on one member of the Holy Trinity more than another? Why or why not?

- Glorious, Holy and Indivisible Trinity, may all my days be spent in your praise, for you are my God: my Creator, my Redeemer, my Advocate.
