Fr Roy writes: Fr. Mark has recently written an article on the reception of the Holy Communion. He wrote that, as you make your way up to receive Holy Communion do not treat it as a queue at the checkout at the supermarket. It is a procession as a pilgrimage to a very sacred place, to the altar of God who loves us and who shares with us the Holy Sacrament of the Body and Blood of the Son of God, our Lord, Jesus Christ. It is a very sacred time as we walk the **pilgrimage** one step at a time. This is a time of reflection on our spiritual life, where we have not shown the humility of Jesus, of the obedience of Jesus, of the devotion of Jesus at prayer, and of many other things in which we have strayed, with words like "**Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed**". We confess our sins humbly and devoutly and receive God's forgiveness. We still know, however, that because of our humanity, we will be tempted, and we will fall again despite of our best intentions at repentance.

This leads me to my second point of **nourishment**. We are now in front of the priest who is offering you the nourishment provided by God in the consecrated Bread and Wine, the Body and Blood of Jesus.

At the Last Supper Jesus

"took bread and gave you thanks;
he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying,
'Take, eat:

this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.'

In the same way, after supper
he took the cup and gave you thanks;
he gave it to them, saying,

'Drink this, all of you;
this is my blood of the new covenant
which is shed for you and for many
for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it,
in remembrance of me.'" From last Sunday's Eucharist

“Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the whole world.”

These words lead us to ever wonder at the miracle of Jesus’ Presence among us. This is the Real Presence of Jesus within us in the Bread and Wine, the Body and Blood of Jesus to nourish our heart and soul with food and drink to enable us to live life as God would have us live.

And so, we return to our seat with joy in our heart at the miracle we have received, the Body and Blood of our Saviour to nourish us in faith, hope and love for God and our fellow human beings in the days to come. We are here again next Sunday to worship and be refreshed and nourished in the Lord.

Keep well, keep safe, keep social distancing, continue to wear a face mask and the blessing of God be upon you and on all who you love and pray for and may your days and nights be holy, good, and peaceful. **AMEN**

Far be it from you to do such a thing, to slay the righteous with the wicked, so that the righteous fare as the wicked! Far be that from you! Shall not the Judge of all the earth do what is just?' And the LORD said, 'If I find at Sodom fifty righteous in the city, I will forgive the whole place for their sake.' Abraham answered, 'Let me take it upon myself to speak to the Lord, I who am but dust and ashes. Suppose five of the fifty righteous are lacking? Will you destroy the whole city for lack of five?' And he said, 'I will not destroy it if I find forty-five there.' Again he spoke to him, 'Suppose forty are found there.' He answered, 'For the sake of forty I will not do it.' Then he said, 'Oh do not let the Lord be angry if I speak. Suppose thirty are found there.' He answered, 'I will not do it, if I find thirty there.' He said, 'Let me take it upon myself to speak to the Lord. Suppose twenty are found there.' He answered, 'For the sake of twenty I will not destroy it.' Then he said, 'Oh do not let the Lord be angry if I speak just once more. Suppose ten are found there.' He answered, 'For the sake of ten I will not destroy it.'

A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Colossians Chapter 2, verses 6 - 15

As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving.

See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the universe, and not according to Christ. For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, and

you have come to fullness in him, who is the head of every ruler and authority. In him also you were circumcised with a spiritual circumcision, by putting off the body of the flesh in the circumcision of Christ; when you were buried with him in baptism, you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead. And when you were dead in trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive together with him, when he forgave us all our trespasses, erasing the record that stood against us with its legal demands. He set this aside, nailing it to the cross. He disarmed the rulers and authorities and made a public example of them, triumphing over them in it.

**The Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke,
Chapter 11, verses 1 - 13.**

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

He was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name.

Your kingdom come.

Give us each day our daily bread.

And forgive us our sins,

for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us.

And do not bring us to the time of trial.'

And he said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say to him, "Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; for a friend of mine has arrived, and I have nothing to set before him." And he answers from within, "Do not bother me; the door has already been locked, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything." I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs.

'So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish? Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'
