FROM THE RECTOR

"<u>A ROYAL WASTE OF TIME</u>"

I found this little reflection about worship very helpful and you may too.

"Worship is a waste of time. That is the first thing that must be asserted in any useful discussion of the Christian custom of gathering regularly to praise the God of heaven and earth. For the praise of God is what worship is all about. Like the ethos of Sabbath at its roots, worship is not primarily about productive work. Worship is distorted and even perverted if it is made instrumental, the means to some other end than glorifying and honoring God. Today we can hear a growing chorus of voices saying that regular worship and clean Christian living makes people happier, healthier, and – some would add – wealthier. But if people undertake worship in order to become happy and healthy, they are using God as a means to their own ends. Yet, if worship does not show us that the God met in Israel and Jesus Christ is not a god to be used, what does it show us? Instrumentalized worship is debased worship, worship reduced to psychological therapy or political consciousness-raising. True and right worship (literally orthodoxy) is first and foremost the service of God and needs no further justification."

A Reading from Exodus Chapter 32 verse 7 – 14

The LORD said to Moses, 'Go down at once! Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely; they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf, and have worshipped it and sacrificed to it, and said, "These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!" ' The LORD said to Moses, 'I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are. Now let me alone, so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them; and of you I will make a great nation.'

But Moses implored the LORD his God, and said, 'O LORD, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? Why should the Egyptians say, "It was with evil intent that he brought them out to kill them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth"? Turn from your fierce wrath; change your mind and do not bring disaster on your people. Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, your servants, how you swore to them by your own self, saying to them, "I will multiply your descendants like the stars of heaven, and all this land that I have promised I will give to your descendants, and they shall inherit it for ever." ' And the LORD changed his mind about the disaster that he planned to bring on his people.

- 1 Have mercy on me, O God, in your enduring goodness: according to the fulness of your compassion blot out my offences.
- 2 Wash me thoroughly from my wickedness: and cleanse me from my sin.
- 3 For I acknowledge my rebellion: and my sin is ever before me.
- 4 Against you only have I sinned and done what is evil in your eyes: so you will be just in your sentence and blameless in your judging.
- 5 Surely in wickedness I was brought to birth: and in sin my mother conceived me.

- 7 Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean: wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

- 10 Create in me a clean heart, O God: and renew a right spirit within me.

A Reading from The First Letter of Paul to Timothy Chapter 1, verses 1 – 2 and 12 – 19a.

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the command of God our Saviour and of Christ Jesus our hope,

To Timothy, my loyal child in the faith:

Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful and appointed me to his service, even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the foremost. But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience, making me an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life. To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

I am giving you these instructions, Timothy, my child, in accordance with the prophecies made earlier about you, so that by following them you may fight the good fight, having faith and a good conscience. By rejecting conscience, certain persons have suffered shipwreck in the faith.

Hear the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

God was in Christ, to reconcile the world to himself; and the Good News of reconciliation he has entrusted to us.

Alleluia!

The Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke, Chapter 15, verses 1 – 10.

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

Now all the tax-collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, 'This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.'

So he told them this parable: 'Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbours, saying to them, "Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost." Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who need no repentance.

'Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? When she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbours, saying, "Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost." Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents.'

MISSION NEWS

Bush Church Aid Society (BCA)

We are focusing this month on the Bush Church Aid Society (BCA).

In his editorial in the latest BCA prayer notes, the Reverend Neville Naden, Indigenous Ministry Officer, reflects on the work of great indigenous leaders such as William Cooper, David Unaipon and Pastor Sir Doug Nicholls. These men spoke out for the rights of indigenous people as far back as the late 1800's. All these men were Christians, and they spoke out about the treatment of aboriginal people and the injustices done and sought to put things right.

Today, Nungalinya College in the Northern Territory is a combined churches training college for indigenous Australians based in Darwin. The Anglican dean of the college is Ruth Walton who is supported by BCA. Students are given the opportunity to study, grow in their faith and be encouraged and prepared to return to serve in their home churches. Please support them by asking for BCA box. SAFE MINISTRY TRAINING

Ordinary Sunday 24C [Pentecost 14] – Sunday 11 September 2022

• Jeremiah 4.11-12, 22-28; Psalm 14; *either* 1 Timothy 1.1-2, 12-19a *or* 1 Timothy 1; Luke 15.1-10

This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them. The Pharisees' jibe is something that Jesus may well have worn as a badge of honour. How lucky for us that this fellow Jesus does precisely that. Were it up to our own level of righteousness we would never be able to feast with Jesus, but that is what he calls us to do week by week at the Eucharistic feast. What a joy that is. George Herbert expresses his eagerness for the Eucharist in his 1633 poem, *The Banquet*:

Welcome sweet and sacred cheer,

Welcome deare;

With me, in me, live and dwell:

For thy neatnesse passeth sight,

Thy delight

Passeth tongue to taste or tell.
