Sermon for a Special Service of Commemoration Marking the Death of Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II at Holy Trinity, Terrigal Parish.

25 September 2022

It is with an emotion of deepest humility that I have been invited to preach on this occasion marking the life and death of the Queen.

Many great men and women have spoken of the life and death of Queen Elizabeth II and here you have little old Father Roy.

I grew up in a royalist family and sang "God Save the King" at school and at the matinee at the Saturday picture theatre " the flicks"

We lived through the death of two kings and the abdication of another.

Then came an attractive, newly married, young Princess Elizabeth to be crowned Queen of Great Britain. and the British Empire followed by a visit to Australia in February 1954.

I was among the enthusiastic crowds who lined streets in Newcastle to have a fleeting glance at our Queen as the car went past.

I, along with many others, ran from one street to another to catch a second glance at our Queen.

Little did we know of the character of Queen Elizabeth II that would be built during the next 70 years.

First, there was her absolute dedication to her people, her family, her God, and Church.

She accepted the title endowed on King Henry VIII of "Defender of the Faith". And she was truly the "Defender of the Faith" in the Church of England.

This was reflected in her love for God and for people in her spiritual life and devotion and for God's creatures especially her horses, and dogs and ravens in the Tower of London. Her attributes are many, love, joy, building reconciliation among communities, individuals, states and countries and her ability to put people at ease on meeting with her, they are all derived from her Christian Faith.

She was always ready to speak of her Christian Faith and its place in her life.

Her body has been laid to rest among her beloved family while her soul lives with them for all eternity.

We give thanks to God for her life and work, her influence around the world in good and hard times, in Great Britain and in the Commonwealth of which we are a part.

We commit her soul to rest and resurrection in God's Kingdom now and forever more. Amen.

A Reading from The Second Letter of Paul to Timothy Chapter 1, verses 1 – 14

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, for the sake of the promise of life that is in Christ Jesus,

To Timothy, my beloved child:

Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

I am grateful to God—whom I worship with a clear conscience, as my ancestors did—when I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. Recalling your tears, I long to see you so that I may be filled with joy. I am reminded of your sincere

faith, a faith that lived first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, lives in you. For this reason I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands; for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline.

Do not be ashamed, then, of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner, but join with me in suffering for the gospel, relying on the power of God, who saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works but according to his own purpose and grace. This grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Saviour Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. For this gospel I was appointed a herald and an apostle and a teacher, and for this reason I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know the one in whom I have put my trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that day what I have entrusted to him. Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. Guard the good treasure entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us.

Hear the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

Alleluia, alleluia!

The word of the Lord stands for ever: it is the word given to you, the Good News.

Alleluia!

The Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke, Chapter 17, verses 5 – 10.

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith!' The Lord replied, 'If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, "Be uprooted and planted in the sea", and it would obey you.

'Who among you would say to your slave who has just come in from ploughing or tending sheep in the field, "Come here at once and take your place at the table"? Would you not rather say to him, "Prepare supper for me, put on your apron and serve me while I eat and drink; later you may eat and drink"? Do you thank the slave for doing what was commanded? So you also, when you have done all that you were ordered to do, say, "We are worthless slaves; we have done only what we ought to have done!" '

Duty seems a rather old-fashioned thing to talk about, though we have heard much about it recently in reference the late Queen. Some of us will be old enough to remember when we heard day by day, week by week Cranmer's post-communion prayer, beseeching God 'to accept this our bounden duty and service; not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offences'. Perhaps he had today's reading from St Luke on his mind as he

wrote. As Christians our duty is to do what God asks of us. Happy are we if we can genuinely say 'We are worthless slaves; we have done only what we ought to have done!' for it is then that Jesus, our God who took on the form of a slave (Philippians 2.7), calls us his friends.
