SEASONS BEGINNINGS AND ENDINGS

Towards the end of the Church Year, our lectionary readings focus on the end times and the reign of Christ in glory.

At the beginning of November, we celebrate the Feast of All Saints on November 1st. It can also be celebrated on the first Sunday in November, so we are observing it on Sunday 6th November. All Saints is an opportunity to celebrate those heroes of faith who by the witness of their lives and often by their deaths, serve as examples of faithfulness to our Lord in all circumstances of life.

All Souls' Day, the 2nd November, gives us an opportunity to remember with gratitude those known to us personally who have entered the nearer presence of God. They are often the "unsung heroes" of faith whom we have known and whose memory we hold dear. The Eucharist for All Souls will be celebrated by Fr Roy Hazlewood in the Founders' Chapel at 5pm this Wednesday, 2nd November at 5pm. If you would like a loved one remembered at this Eucharist, please write his/her name on the sheet on the table in the narthex and they will be mentioned during the Intercessions.

The last Sunday of the Church Year is the Feast of Christ the King. This looks to the fulfillment of all things in the reign of Christ in glory. It is also a time to reaffirm our allegiance to the kingdom of God as opposed to those "lesser kingdoms" that seek to rule our lives. We then move into Advent, the season of waiting and preparation for the coming of God among us in the Incarnation of Jesus at Christmas, and his coming again in glory at the end of the age.

ONE USE PLATES, CUPS, CUTLERY BANNED

As of the 1st November, 2022, the NSW Government is banning single-use items including plastic straws, stirrers, cutlery, plates, bowls and cotton buds, food ware and cups made from expanded polystyrene and some personal care items.

Banned items cannot be sold or given away for free after the 1st November. The ban applies even if the items are made from biodegradable, compostable, or bio-plastics. This includes those made from Australian certified compostable plastic.

Fines up to \$275,000 apply if we use or supply any of these products.

Please be aware that the church will now be using either paper cups, plates and bamboo cutlery or stainless-steel cutlery and the blue China.
