Samaritans - Social Justice and the 2013 Federal Election.

- * Reducing Homelessness by 50% by 2020, and increasing affordable housing
- * Affirmative employment policy for people with disabilities and mental illness
- * Child Protection support and intervention to vulnerable families with children under six, * National Disability Insurance scheme extended to include people over 65 years.
- * Refugees an increase in the annual intake, and negotiation of a long term solution to

the asylum seeker issues with neighbouring countries

* The new government to seek bipartisan support for a referendum which will give

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people recognition in the Australian Constitution.

A reading from the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke, Chapter 14. 1, 7-14.

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ

On one occasion when Jesus was going to the house of a leader of the Pharisees to eat a meal on the sabbath, they were watching him closely.

When he noticed how the guests chose the places of honour, he told them a parable. 'When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not sit down at the place of honour, in case someone more distinguished than you has been invited by your host; and the host who invited both of you may come and say to you, "Give this person your place", and then in disgrace you would start to take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, "Friend, move up higher"; then you will be honoured in the presence of all who sit at the table with you. For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.'

He said also to the one who had invited him, 'When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbours, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.'

Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

Fr. Roy writes:

During my time in the priesthood I have been called by many names. Some of the more polite names have been "a man of God", "a man of the cloth", "a sky pilot", "Padre", "Rector", "Vicar", "Mr. Hazlewood" and even Fr. Roy. I try to answer to any of these and use this as an illustration because I am going to refer to you as "women and men of God". In my writing on ministry during the past weeks I have referred to you as the "Laos" that translates to the "People of God". Thus, you are "men and women of God", "God's beloved". You are to show, then, that you are "of God" and "with God".

This leads me to remember that you and I, whether not ordained or ordained, have received a call to holiness. This is a call to an intimate relationship with God. I am not writing about being sanctimonious or having a negative kind of holiness, all of which comes down to displaying a "holier than thou" attitude. Such behaviour comes down to its being "all about me" and of one's superiority over others. Such behaviour certainly puts people off. Genuine holiness is quite different to this.

Genuine holiness in a woman or man "of God" will be characterised by frequency of prayer and not merely an occasional exercise, to live in God's love, responding to God's love by showing God's love in our love for others. This at least should be the intention of everyone who is a man or woman of God. For assistance to work to this kind of holiness the man or woman can look to the ancient customs of the Church. One such custom is to give time each day to pray the "Daily Office". This is to be found in "A Prayer Book for Australia" with an "Office" for Morning and Evening Prayer suitable for each day of the week. This can be used on one's own or in the company of others. The morning office is prayed on Monday to Friday at Holy Trinity at 8 a.m. You are welcome to join with the others whenever you are able. Wherever you pray in this way there are always others who are praying the Daily Office in some part of the world. Personally I pray

Morning Prayer at 6.30 a.m. and Evening Pray at 7.00 p.m. These are convenient times for me to start the day and after I come home from the campus at Ourimbah. In this way we join with fellow Christians in the daily worship of God. The Daily Office provides us with a pattern for prayer of praise, thanksgiving, confession, prayer for the needs of others and for ourselves. In prayer we show our love for God, for others and for ourselves. If you would like some help with using "A Prayer Book for Australia" in this way or in using a Lectionary to show the Psalms and Readings for the day ask one of the priests in the parish for some assistance.

In Holy Communion or the Eucharist we have the chief act of Christian worship. This tradition comes from the early Church where Christians met together for the "breaking of bread and the prayers". This is worship in which we all participate as the women and men of God as frequently as possible. When a group of Africans who walked all day on Saturday from their village in order to be present at the Eucharist were asked why they did this they replied: "The Lord is there. How can I stay away?"

Having thought about sacrament and prayer, it is important for each person to be aware of her/his personal life of devotion. This is each man and woman's intimate relationship with God and the love of God in all things. This is nurtured by prayer that is owned by each person, meditation on the love of God in Christ Jesus and an awareness of our personal relationship with God throughout the day. This is our seeking after God in response to God's continual seeking after each person. The aim of this personal life of devotion including prayer is not to change God's will about an issue so that it conforms more to our wishes. The aim is to let our wishes conform to God's will. The outcome of this personal life of devotion and prayer is in the active acceptance of the will of God.
