It's time again to get out your knitting needles and start knitting beanies.

If you haven't got time to learn to knit, you can buy some warm socks or toiletries for the seafarers that come for comfort and assistance at the Mission to Seafarers in the Port of Newcastle. Ninety per cent of the world's goods are carried by sea. Without seafarers our economy would grind to a halt. Many of the seafarers that come into our ports have little personal comforts or warm clothing as many of them are from hotter climates in Asian countries.

Many seafarers send all their wages home to their families, often allowing them to seek medical care and schooling for their children. They love our beanies, socks and toiletries. We also send them Bibles which are available for them to use at the Centre and take if they wish.
