¹ I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.² Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of Godwhat is good and acceptable and perfect. ³ For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgement, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. ⁴ For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, ⁵ so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. ⁶ We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ⁷ ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; ⁸ the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.

If you don't have access to a computer or are not confident on the computer, I am happy to help you in the office.

Instructions for both CrimCheck and Safe Ministry Training are as follows:

Online visit the Diocese's Online Self-Service Portal here: crimcheck.org.au/check/newcastleanglican

and complete an application for a Criminal History Check. (Using this link means the Diocese will pay for it.) You and the Diocesan Office will be notified of the results and will receive a final Criminal History Check Certificate which will need to be <u>forwarded</u> to our office (by you). The address is:

Volunteers will need to complete the first 9 modules, not all 11 modules.

Once you have completed the training, please either email the letter of completion or bring a hard copy into the office so that I can update your record with the new date of completion.

I am here to assist you so please ask for help if you need it. We know it is a lot to ask but it is a requirement to keep our children and vulnerable people safe. We are so grateful for your co-operation and time.
