


# Welcome to worship at Holy Trinity, Terrigal THE BAPTISM OF OUR LORD

### A Reading from Genesis Chapter 1, verse 1 - 5

¹ In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, ² the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. ³ Then God said, `Let there be light'; and there was light. ⁴ And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵ God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

#### Psalm 29

- <sup>1</sup> Ascribe to the Lord, you powers of heaven: ascribe to the Lord glory and might.
- <sup>2</sup> Ascribe to the Lord the honour due to his name: O worship the Lord in the beauty of his holiness.

- The voice of the Lord is upon the waters: the God of glory thunders, the Lord upon the great waters.
- <sup>4</sup> The voice of the Lord is mighty in operation: the voice of the Lord is a glorious voice.
- <sup>5</sup> The voice of the Lord breaks the cedar-trees: the Lord breaks in pieces the cedars of Lebanon.
- <sup>6</sup> He makes them skip like a calf: Lebanon and Sirion like a young wild ox.
- <sup>7</sup> The voice of the Lord divides the lightning-flash: the voice of the Lord whirls the sands of the desert, the Lord whirls the desert of Kadesh.
- 8 The voice of the Lord rends the terebinth trees, and strips bare the forests: in his temple all cry 'Glory.'
- The Lord sits enthroned above the water-flood: the Lord sits enthroned as a king for ever.
- 10 The Lord will give strength to his people: the Lord will give to his people the blessing of peace.

#### A reading from The Acts of the Apostles Chapter 19, verses 1 – 7

¹ While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul passed through the inland regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples. ² He said to them, 'Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?' They replied, 'No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit.' ³ Then he said, 'Into what then were you baptized?' They answered, 'Into John's baptism.' ⁴ Paul said, 'John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus.' ⁵ On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. ⁶ When Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied— ³ altogether there were about twelve of them.

# The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark, Chapter 1, verses 4 - 11

<sup>4</sup> John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. <sup>5</sup> And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. 6 Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. 7 He proclaimed, 'The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. 8 I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.' 9 In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. 10 And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. 11 And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

### **Being Together**

Jesus told us to love one another as he loves us.

As Christians we know our life together is strengthened when our behaviour is consistent with our faith. However, our experience of being together can be difficult, particularly when there are differences. So it is important to be clear about how we will behave towards each other.

#### **Being a Community:**

- We will value the wellbeing and safety of others, especially children and other vulnerable people.
- We will encourage each other to participate in the life of the church.
- We will consider the impact of our behaviour on others.

#### Relating to each other:

- We will protect the safety of all, especially children and other vulnerable people.
- We will treat each other with respect and dignity, irrespective of ability, gender, sexuality, race, age or contribution to the church.
- We will act with integrity and honesty in our interactions with each other.

## Communicating with each other:

- We will communicate respectfully with others, and not in a way that threatens, belittles or humiliates.
- We will speak with integrity and honesty, and refrain from speculation and gossip.

#### **Acknowledging differences:**

- We will respect those who are different from us and not isolate or ridicule them.
- We will listen to and seek to understand the beliefs, opinions and practices of others, even when we do not share their views.

#### **Responding to conflict:**

- We will accept responsibility for our part in a conflict.
- We will be willing to play our part in resolving a conflict. (Approved by General Synod July 2014, revised on 17 April 2020) (Approved by Newcastle Diocesan Synod October 2015, Revision adopted by the Diocesan Council from 15 May 2021)
