A Reading from the Book of Jeremiah Chapter 18. verses 1 - 11.

CARD AND BOOK SHOP

There are some cards in the book shop which have been marked down. Have a look for a bargain.

I am appealing to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I have become during my imprisonment. Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful both to you and to me. I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you. I wanted to keep him with me, so that he might be of service to me in your place during my imprisonment for the gospel; but I preferred to do nothing without your consent, in order that your good deed might be voluntary and not something forced. Perhaps this is the reason he was separated from you for a while, so that you might have him back for ever, no longer as a slave but as more than a slave, a beloved brother—especially to me but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord.

So if you consider me your partner, welcome him as you would welcome me. If he has wronged you in any way, or owes you anything, charge that to my account. I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand: I will repay it. I say nothing about your owing me even your own self. Yes, brother, let me have this benefit from you in the Lord! Refresh my heart in Christ. Confident of your obedience, I am writing to you, knowing that you will do even more than I say.

One thing more—prepare a guest room for me, for I am hoping through your prayers to be restored to you. Epaphras, my fellow-prisoner in Christ Jesus, sends greetings to you, and so do Mark, Aristarchus, Demas, and Luke, my fellow-workers.

The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit.

A reading from the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke, Chapter 14. 25-35.

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ

Now large crowds were travelling with him; and he turned and said to them, 'Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it? Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, saying, "This fellow began to build and was not able to finish." Or what king, going out to wage war against another king, will not sit down first and consider whether he is able with ten thousand to oppose the one who comes against him with twenty thousand? If he cannot, then, while the other is still far away, he sends a delegation and asks for the terms of peace. So therefore, none of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions.

'Salt is good; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is fit neither for the soil nor for the manure heap; they throw it away. Let anyone with ears to hear listen!'

Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

The rhythm of worship and mission

When Jesus is asked to name the greatest commandment, he will not be tied to a single answer but gives a twofold reply:

'The first is, "Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength." The second is this, "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." There is no other commandment greater than these.' 13

There is a balance and a rhythm in the Christian life between loving God expressed in our worship, which refreshes, renews and sustains our identity, and loving our neighbour, expressed in mission according to our particular gifts. When Jesus gathers the group of twelve disciples, he calls them 'to be with him, and to be sent out to proclaim the message'. The pattern of the life in the Gospels, as far as the disciples are concerned, is expressed in this rhythm of being with Jesus and being sent out by Jesus. The picture is not one of spending years only in the company of other disciples and then years of continuous service and mission. Rather it is a rhythm of going out in service and proclamation and coming back together for periods re-orientation, refreshment and reflection.

The same picture emerges from Acts and the Epistles. The apostles do not travel alone but in small groups, able to sustain one another along the way. They do not simply seek the conversion of individual Christians saving souls for heaven. Instead, they intentionally form converts into Christian communities that are able both to build up and sustain the new disciples and become in turn centers for ongoing mission and ministry. The great sacrament of the Eucharist has this rhythm at the heart of its life. The Christian community comes together to be built up and established in its common identity, to be
