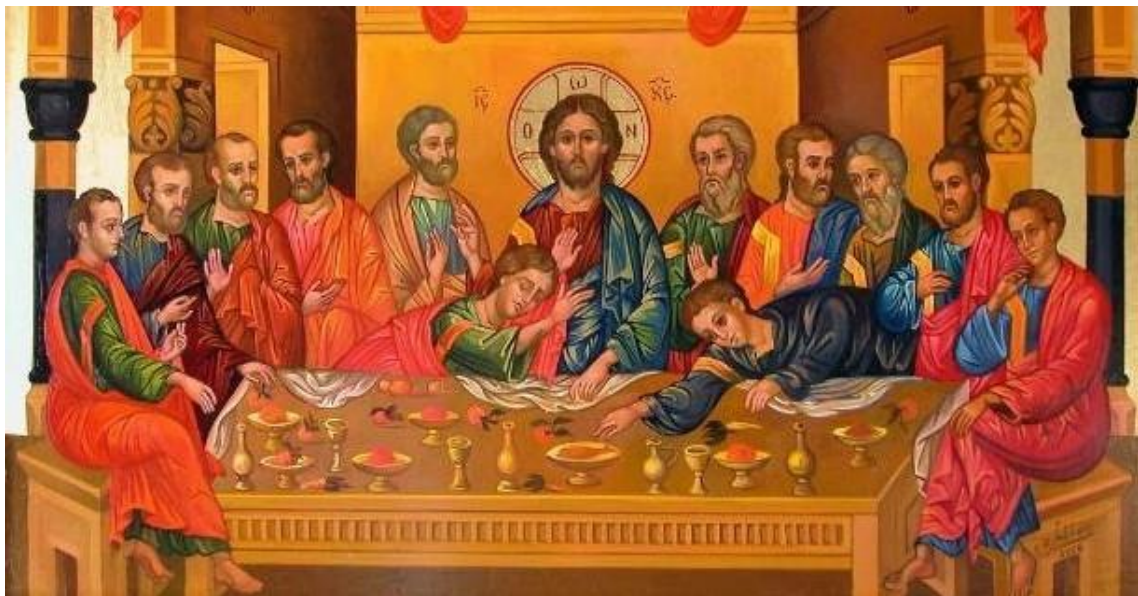

Prayer of the Day

O God,
in a wonderful sacrament
you have given us a memorial of the passion of your dear Son:
grant that we may so reverence
the sacred mysteries of his body and blood
that we may ever know within ourselves
the fruits of his redemption;
who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

A reading from Exodus Chapter 24 verses 3 – 8

3 Moses came and told the people all the words of the LORD and all the ordinances; and all the people answered with one voice, and said, 'All the words that the LORD has spoken we will do.' ⁴And Moses wrote down all the words of the LORD. He rose early in the morning, and built an altar at the foot of the mountain, and set up twelve pillars, corresponding to the twelve tribes of Israel. ⁵He sent young men of the people of Israel, who offered burnt-offerings and sacrificed oxen as offerings of well-being to the LORD. ⁶Moses took half of the blood and put it in basins, and half of the blood he dashed against the altar. ⁷Then he took the book of the covenant, and read it in the hearing of the people; and they said, 'All that the LORD has spoken we will do, and we will be obedient.' ⁸Moses took the blood and dashed it on the people, and said, 'See the blood of the covenant that the LORD has made with you in accordance with all these words.'

'O Lord, I beseech you, deliver me !'**

5 Gracious and righteous is the Lord:
full of compassion is our God.

**6 The Lord preserves the simple:
when I was brought low, he saved me.**

7 Return, O my soul, to your rest:
for the Lord has rewarded you.

**8 For you, O Lord, have delivered my soul from death:
my eyes from tears and my feet from falling.**

9 I will walk before the Lord:

**10 I believed that I would perish, I was brought very low:
I said in my haste 'Everyone is a liar.'**

11 How shall I repay the Lord:
for all his benefits to me?

**12 I will take up the cup of salvation:
and call upon the name of the Lord.**

in the presence of all his people.

**14 Grievous in the sight of the Lord:
is the death of his faithful ones.**

15 O Lord, I am your servant,
your servant and the child of your handmaid:
you have unloosed my bonds.

**16 I will offer you a sacrifice of thanksgiving:
and call upon the name of the Lord.**

17 I will pay my vows to the Lord:
in the presence of all his people,

**18 In the courts of the house of the Lord:
even in your midst, O Jerusalem. Praise the Lord.**

A reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians Chapter 10 verses 14 – 21

14 Therefore, my dear friends, flee from the worship of idols. ¹⁵I speak as to sensible people; judge for yourselves what I say. ¹⁶The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a sharing in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a sharing in the body of Christ? ¹⁷Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread. ¹⁸Consider the people of Israel; are not those who eat the sacrifices partners in the altar? ¹⁹What do I imply then? That food sacrificed to idols is anything, or that an idol is anything? ²⁰No, I imply that what pagans sacrifice, they sacrifice to demons and not to God. I do not want you to be partners with demons. ²¹You cannot drink the cup of the Lord and the cup of demons. You cannot partake of the table of the Lord and the table of demons.

Hear the word of the Lord.

Alleluia, **alleluia!**

I am the living bread from heaven says the Lord;
whoever eats this bread will live for ever.

Alleluia!

A reading from the Gospel of Mark Chapter 14 verses 12 – 16, 22 – 26

12 On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb is sacrificed, his disciples said to him, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?' ¹³So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city, and a man carrying a jar of water will meet you; follow him, ¹⁴and wherever he enters, say to the owner of the house, "The Teacher asks, Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?"' ¹⁵He will show you a large room upstairs, furnished and ready. Make preparations for us there.' ¹⁶So the disciples set out and went to the city, and

found everything as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover meal.

22 While they were eating, he took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it he broke it, gave it to them, and said, 'Take; this is my body.' ²³Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he gave it to them, and all of them drank from it. ²⁴He said to them, 'This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many. ²⁵Truly I tell you, I will never again drink of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God.'

26 When they had sung the hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

Thanksgiving for the Holy Communion – Corpus Christi

Exodus 24.3-8; Psalm 116; 1 Corinthians 10.14-21;
Mark 14.12-16, 22-26

Today the Church celebrates the institution of the Eucharist, where during an ordinary meal Jesus took bread and wine, telling his disciples that those things were his body and his blood, What must the disciples have thought at this left-field statement? What would they have thought at his saying that his blood is poured out for many? I imagine they had many questions, just as we might today. Nonetheless, what we do know is that Jesus' Body and Blood has sustained the faithful day in, day out, for two millennia.
