A reading from the Second Letter of Paul to the Corinthians Chapter 4 verse 13 to Chapter 5 verse 1

¹³ But just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in
accordance with scripture—'I believed, and so I spoke'—we also
believe, and so we speak, ¹⁴ because we know that the one who
raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring
us with you into his presence. ¹⁵ Yes, everything is for your
sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people,
may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God. ¹⁶ So we do not
lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our
inner nature is being renewed day by day. ¹⁷ For this slight
momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of

glory beyond all measure, ¹⁸ because we look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal. ¹ For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

**A reading from the Gospel of Mark
Chapter 3 verses 20 – 35**

²⁰ and the crowd came together again, so that they could not even eat. ²¹ When his family heard it, they went out to restrain him, for people were saying, 'He has gone out of his mind.' ²² And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem said, 'He has Beelzebul, and by the ruler of the demons he casts out demons.' ²³ And he called them to him, and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? ²⁴ If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. ²⁵ And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. ²⁶ And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but his end has come. ²⁷ But no one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his property without first tying up the strong man; then indeed the house can be plundered. ²⁸ 'Truly I tell you, people will be forgiven for their sins and whatever blasphemies they utter; ²⁹ but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit can never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an eternal sin'— ³⁰ for they had said, 'He has an unclean spirit.' ³¹ Then his mother and his brothers came; and standing outside, they sent to him and called him. ³² A crowd was sitting around him; and they said to him, 'Your mother and your brothers and sisters are outside, asking for you.' ³³ And he

replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' ³⁴ And looking at those who sat around him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers! ³⁵ Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother.'
