## **A reading from the Second Letter of Paul to the Corinthians Chapter 6 verses 1 – 13**

- <sup>1</sup> As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain.
- <sup>2</sup> For he says,  
'At an acceptable time I have listened to you,  
and on a day of salvation I have helped you. 'See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation!
- <sup>3</sup> We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry,
- <sup>4</sup> but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities,
- <sup>5</sup> beatings, imprisonments, riots, labours, sleepless nights, hunger;
- <sup>6</sup> by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love,
- <sup>7</sup> truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left;
- <sup>8</sup> in honour and dishonour, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true;
- <sup>9</sup> as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see—we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed;
- <sup>10</sup> as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.
- <sup>11</sup> We have spoken frankly to you Corinthians; our heart is wide open to you.
- <sup>12</sup> There is no restriction in our affections, but only in yours.
- <sup>13</sup> In return—I speak as to children—open wide your hearts also.
