and all the birds of the air had fled.

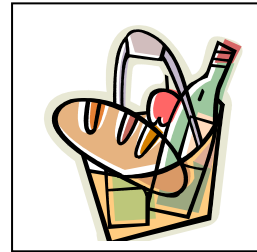
I looked, and lo, the fruitful land was a desert,

A reading from the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke, Chapter 15. 1-10.

Now all the tax-collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, 'This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.'

So he told them this parable: 'Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbours, saying to them, "Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost." Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who need no repentance.

'Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? During these months we have been fed spiritually in worship, in Sacrament and Word and in our life as a community of the People of God in this place. In other words, we, the Laos, the People of God are enthused and spiritually re-created to continue the work that we began with the Parish Consultation.

You have given thought that our parish, the People of God, should be a Christ-centred faith community that worships God in Word and Sacrament and is caring and inclusive of all within the parish and beyond. This brings us to a vision of showing the love of God in Christ Jesus to all, those within our gates and beyond as we spread the 'Good News of the Kingdom' in a non-threatening way.

This brings us to a concept of ministry as one of service. We are slaves of God in and through Jesus and in the strength of the Holy Spirit. This is the "Laos", "the People of God", lay and ordained, worshipping and praying together, working together, ministering together and serving together. This puts before us the obvious, critical question: "Is Christ the centre of my life? Do I really put Christ at the centre of my life?" because there is always the temptation to want to put ourselves at the centre.

How, then, can we bring this about? We have been called to holiness not a holiness that is worn on our shirt sleeve with a "holier than you" attitude. We must be women and men of God who are involved in Bible study, in the writings of the great Christian thinkers of the past and the present with a real commitment to prayer, meditation and

other spiritual exercises. This is our personal relationship with God through Jesus Christ that continues to be strengthened as we participate in the ancient customs of the Church with the Daily Office of Morning and Evening Prayer and our frequent and regular worship in the Holy Eucharist.

We give thanks to God for the things we have been able to accomplish in the past and pray that we may be faithful ministers as the men and women of God with a love and inclusiveness towards other people that reflects God's love and inclusiveness for all people. We will show to others "that we have been with Jesus".
