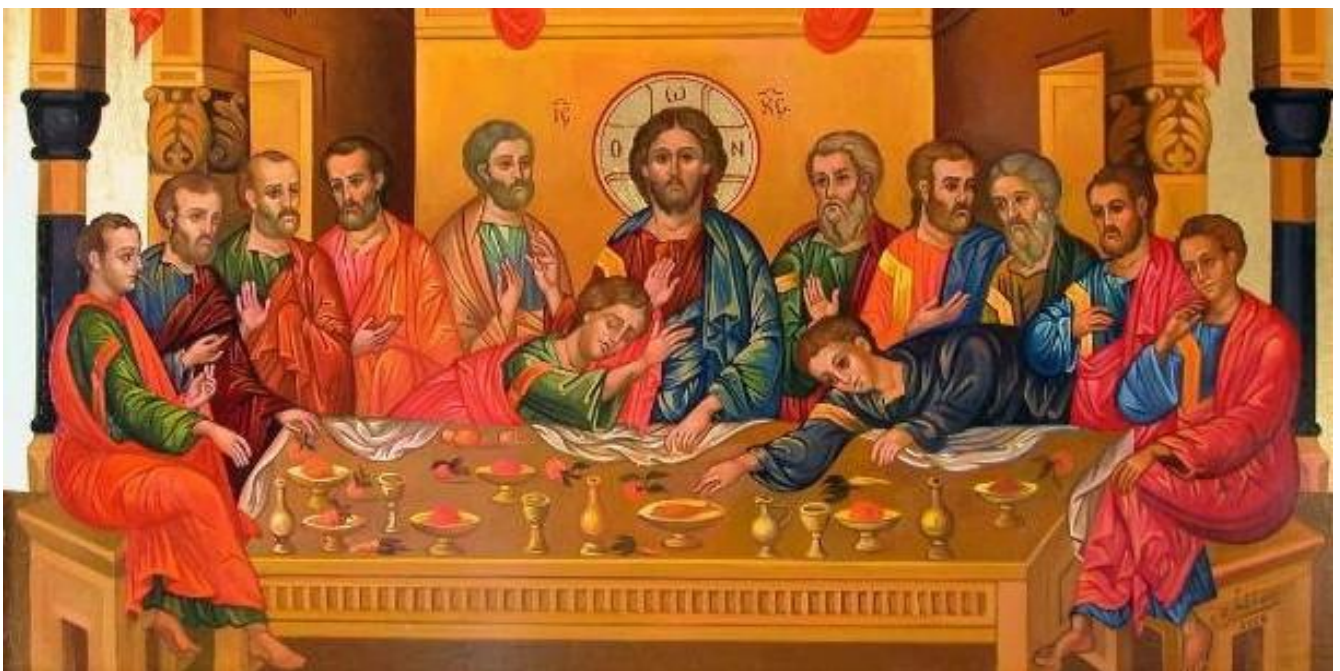

CORPUS CHRISTI/Thanksgiving for the Holy Communion

In 1971 the Anglican-Roman Catholic International Commission (ARCIC) announced that it had achieved substantial agreement on the core doctrine of the Eucharist, recognising it as a memorial of Christ' sacrifice, a means of grace, and a real presence of Christ.

Prayer of the Day

Oh God,
in a wonderful sacrament
you have given us a memorial of the passion of your dear Son:
grant that we may so reverence
the sacred mysteries of his body and blood
that we may ever know within ourselves
the fruits of his redemption;
who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

A Reading from Exodus Chapter 24, verses 3 – 8

³ Moses went and told the people all the words of the Lord and all the ordinances, and all the people answered with one voice and said, "All the words that the Lord has spoken we will do." ⁴ And Moses wrote down all the words of the Lord. He rose early in the morning, built an altar at the foot of the mountain, and set up twelve pillars, corresponding to the twelve tribes of Israel. ⁵ He sent young men of the Israelites, who offered burnt offerings and sacrificed oxen as offerings of well-being to the Lord. ⁶ Moses took half of the blood and put it in basins, and half of the blood he dashed against the altar. ⁷ Then he took the book of the covenant and read it in the hearing of the people, and they said, "All that the Lord has spoken we will do, and we will be obedient." ⁸ Moses took the blood and dashed it on the people, and said,
"Here is the blood of the covenant that the Lord has made with you in accordance with all these words."

Psalm 116

'O Lord, I beseech you, deliver me !'**
5 Gracious and righteous is the Lord:

A Reading from 1 Corinthians Chapter 10, verses 14 – 21

¹⁴ Therefore, my beloved, flee from the worship of idols. ¹⁵ I speak as to sensible people; judge for yourselves what I say. ¹⁶ The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a sharing in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a sharing in the body of Christ? ¹⁷ Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread. ¹⁸ Consider the people of Israel: Are not those who eat the sacrifices partners in the altar? ¹⁹ What do I imply, then? That food sacrificed to idols is anything or that an idol is anything? ²⁰ No, I imply that what they sacrifice, they sacrifice to demons and not to God. I do not want you to be partners with demons. ²¹ You cannot drink the cup of the Lord and the cup of demons. You cannot partake of the table of the Lord and the table of demons.

whoever eats this bread will live forever.

The Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark Chapter 14 verses 12–16, 22–26

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

¹² On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb is sacrificed, his disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?" ¹³ So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, "Go into the city, and a man carrying a jar of water will meet you; follow him, ¹⁴ and wherever he enters, say to the owner of the house, 'The Teacher asks: Where is my guest room where I

may eat the Passover with my disciples?’ ¹⁵ He will show you a large room upstairs, furnished and ready. Make preparations for us there.” ¹⁶ So the disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and they prepared the Passover meal.

²² While they were eating, he took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it he broke it, gave it to them, and said, “Take; this is my body.” ²³ Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he gave it to them, and all of them drank from it. ²⁴ He said to them, “This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many.” ²⁵ Truly I tell you, I will never again drink of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God.” ²⁶ When they had sung the hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

Thanksgiving for the Holy Communion – Corpus Christi

Exodus 24.3–8; Psalm 116; 1 Corinthians 10.14–21;

Mark 14.12–16, 22–26

Today we celebrate the institution of the Eucharist, the Church's food on earth. Mark tells us how it happened, in the middle of Jesus' betrayal by Judas at a Passover meal.

Despite all of the drama caused by Judas, Jesus nonetheless thinks of the ongoing life of the disciples after his death and tells them that whenever they eat bread and drink wine, they are to remember that he is giving them his Body and Blood.

- Lord, help me to be strengthened by the Sacred Banquet as I receive Christ's Body and Blood under the guise of bread and wine.
